Daily reading

Daily counting

Use your number cards to pick a random number. How quickly can you count to that number? What is one more than that number? What is one less than that number?

Tricky words

Please take time to learn your tricky words.
These can be found in your learning pack that we have sent home.

Concentrate on the words that you know you find tricky and choose a few words to practise each day. Here are some activities you may not have tried yet. Perhaps you could do one a day this week.

- Peg the tricky words on a line. Unpeg them and put them in a basket when you know them
- Put the tricky words in a box. Rummage around and pick out a tricky word to read
- Write the tricky words on a label and stick them to a toy car. Draw some parking spaces with the matching tricky word on a piece of paper. Drive in the matching tricky word!
- Write the tricky word in lots of different sizes!
- Chalk the tricky word on paper, chalkboard or paving.

Daily Maths

Did you enjoy the number grid game? If you have your grid, you might like to have another go today. Today, draw a circle and split it into 10 equal pieces. You could make it into a cake or a pizza! Talk about how 10 is the whole number. Choose a number of pieces to take away. (E.g. How many pieces would you have left if Daddy took 3?) Can you write this as a number sentence?
To challenge, you might like to talk about whether it would be fair for someone to have 3 pieces and someone else to have 7 pieces.

Daily English/Phonics

Phonics:

Today's sound is 'or'.
Can you think of any 'or' words yourself?
Write out the words in pre-cursive handwriting – for, fort, port, sort
Can you circle the digraph 'or' in each word?
Can you explain to your adult what a digraph is? (e.g. key - 2 letters that make one sound)
What does 'or' look like in capital letters?

Can you write about the Big Carrot using these tricky words in your sentences:
they, go, have, some
