Daily reading	<p>We hope that you were able to access this week's story, Quiz. https://www.oxfordowl.co.uk/api/digital_books/1361.html Today, have a go at Activity 2. If you are unable to access this eBook, please used the PDF version of the same story that we have attached for you. See if you can pick out all of the words beginning with 'th'.</p>
Daily counting	<p>Today, you are going to use one set of number cards and the set of your picture cards that you made yesterday. We are going to play the memory game again, although today it is slightly trickier due to having to match the number with a quantity. To start with, you might find it easier to have the cards facing upwards so that you can see them and if you find this too easy, you can then turn them over.</p>
Tricky words	<p>Please take time to learn your tricky words. These can be found in your learning pack that we have sent home. Concentrate on the words that you know you find tricky and choose a few words to practise each day. Here are some activities you may not have tried yet. Perhaps you could do one a day this week.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Spread the tricky words out on the floor. Say a tricky word. Your child has to run and jump on the tricky word. - Put all the tricky words inside a bag. Your child needs to pick one out and read it. If they're unsure, pop it back inside the bag ready for another try. - Write the tricky word in writing pencil. Then go over the top with coloured pencil. Then with a felt tip pen. Then with a crayon! How many different things can you use to write the tricky word? - Bury the tricky words something like sand, soil, under rice, in slime! Pick one out and have a go at reading it! - Speed Challenge! How many tricky words can you read in 1 minute?
Daily Maths	<p>Today, we would like you to copy and complete these number sentences into your book. You can use the tens and ones grid from yesterday to help you.</p> <p> $10 + 1 =$ $10 + 2 =$ $10 + 3 =$ $10 + 4 =$ $10 + 5 =$ $10 + 6 =$ $10 + 7 =$ $10 + 8 =$ $10 + 9 =$ $10 + 10 =$ </p> <p>Some children might need support writing these number sentences. You could use a yellow pen and ask your child to go over it or write parts of the number sentence and ask your child to fill in the blank spaces.</p>
Daily English/Phonics	<p>Phonics: Today's sound is 'air'. Can you think of any 'air' words yourself? Write out these words in pre-cursive handwriting – fair, stair, airbag Can you circle the trigraph 'air' in each word? (e.g. <u>ma</u>ch - 3 letters that make one sound) Can you explain to your adult what a trigraph is? What does " look like in capital letters?</p> <p>Optional game - https://new.phonicsplay.co.uk/resources/phase/3/dragons-den Please pick a phase suitable to your child's ability.</p>
