Measuring – We all know what two metres is now, but can you work out what one metre is? What other measurements do you know? Try using a string or a ruler to measure different objects and compare them.

Tricky words

Please take time to learn your tricky words. These can be found in your learning pack that we have sent home.

Concentrate on the words that you know you find tricky and choose a few words to practise each day. Here are some activities you may not have tried yet. Perhaps you could do one a day this week.

- Spread the tricky words out on the floor. Say a tricky word. Your child has to run and jump on the tricky word.
- Put all the tricky words inside a bag. Your child needs to pick one out and read it. If they're
 unsure, pop it back inside the bag ready for another try.
- Write the tricky word in writing pencil. Then go over the top with coloured pencil. Then with a felt tip pen. Then with a crayon! How many different things can you use to write the tricky word?
- Bury the tricky words something like sand, soil, under rice, in slime! Pick one out and have a go at reading it!
- Speed Challenge! How many tricky words can you read in 1 minute?
