	You will need - months of the year cards, a paper plate (or print out the template at the end of today's learning) a split pin (or straw).
	Hide the months of the year cards around the room.
	Children to collect them in the correct order.
	Then make a 'year wheel' to help children to learn about the order of the months.

	 Split the paper plate in to twelve sections. Write the months of the year in order, one in each section. Attach the paper plate to a piece of paper with a split pin (or you can use a stick or straw)
	Put on the headings, Last month, This month, Next month Use the wheel to ask questions.
	e.g What month was last month? - If this month is July, what month will the next one be?
	Challenge - mark on the seasons
Daily English/	Writing: The first teddy bear was made over 100 years ago. Watch this YouTube clip to find out more.

	There are lots of famous teddy bears like Paddington Bear, Rupert Bear, Winnie the Pooh, Little Bear Lost and Baloo Bear. Draw a picture of your favourite bear in your book. It could be a famous bear, or it could be your own very special bear.
	Next, talk to a grown up and describe your bear to them. Now you are ready to write some sentences describing your bear. Remember to start each sentence with a capital letter and end with a full stop, and also include lots of interesting adjectives.
	Dictated sentence: Please read the sentence to your child. Then re-read slowly one word at a time while your child writes the sentence.

	Create a compliment game - Sit with people in your household and take it in turns to say something about each other and try and guess who the compliment is for. You could describe how they look or something about their personality (eg. they are kind). Practice receiving a compliment as much as giving.
Problem of the Day	Challenge – So many lovely things grow at this time of year. Can you build a vegetable garden? Use Lego, blocks, recycling objects (make sure you check with an adult if they are clean and safe to use) to create your vegetable garden.
	Riddle of the day – What never asks questions but is often answered?
