	Using coloured pencils in different ways can help to make parts of words memorable. You could
	highlight the tricky parts of the word or write the tricky part in a different colour. You could also write each letter in a different colour, or write the word in red, then overlay in orange, yellow and so on.
Daily Maths	Rainbow patterns.
	Rainbows have a special 7 pattern.
	We have been drawing a lot of these lately.
	Some people have a rhyme to remember the colours of the rainbow!
	ROY G BIV say it like it's a boy's name.  Red, Orange, Yellow, Green, Blue, Indigo, Violet.
	Can you create your own rainbow and give it a name?
	1. Pick 7 colours but they don't have to be the same as a real rainbow.
	<ol> <li>Have a think! What name will you give your rainbow?</li> <li>Remember it is the first letter of each colour.</li> </ol>

	Do you like mine? Blue, orange, red, purple, pink, avocado, turquoise. BORP PAT!
	There are lots of different colour names. Can you find some unusual ones?
	Here are some colours to match the letters of the vowels to help you.
	A – amber, E – emerald, I – indigo, O – orange, U – ultramarine.
	I made another super rainbow called GOPOPPY! Can you guess what colours I used?

Daily English/	Writing:
Phonics	Think back to your learning yesterday. What is the name of the Jewish Festival that we are learning
	about?
	A machzor is a prayer book that Jewish people use during special festivals. During the festivals, they will read the prayers to help them think about themselves and God. Yom Kippur is a time when Jewish people think about the wrong things they have done and how they can make more right choices to do good things.
	Talk to a grown up about the good things that you could do.
	Now we are going to write a list of your ideas. Each idea needs to be written in a sentence. Remember when you write a list, you write each sentence underneath each other on a new line. You might like to give each sentence a number too. Every sentence needs a capital letter and a full stop. Also try to challenge yourself by including adjectives and extending some sentences with <b>and</b> , <b>but</b> or <b>because</b> . Remember to read your list at the end to check it makes sense and that you have spelt words correctly.
	Correctly.
	<b>Dictated sentence:</b> Please read the sentence to your child. Then re-read slowly one word at a time while your child writes the sentence.

	Extension – Can you extend your sentence using and/because/when?
	Copy the following real and alien words, then put sound buttons on them. Press the buttons to read the words.

	Can you put each of these common exception words into a sentence?
