Make predictions about what you think will happen in this book based on these factors. Afterwards, read the blurb and see if it gives you any further hints. · Continue asking your child questions throughout the book but also encourage them to ask questions as this will further their understanding of the text. • When you have finished the story, is your child able to retell the events in the order in which they happened? If you are reading non-fiction, can they recall any interesting facts that they have read?
