Daily Maths	How tall is that tree?
	Today, you are going to learn how to measure a tree without climbing it or leaving the spot. Look carefully at the sheet that has been attached. This will tell you what you require to find out the height of trees, maybe in your garden or during your daily walk. How many will you measure?
	<b>Outdoor STEM: Measuring Tree Height</b>
	For this activity, you will need:
	<ul> <li>A partner</li> <li>A pencil</li> <li>Something to measure with, like a meter stick, or a tape measure</li> <li>A tree</li> </ul>
	<ol> <li>First, choose a tree to measure. One person stands near the tree, while the other walks away from it. The person walking away will also be the pencil holder.</li> </ol>
	<ol> <li>As they walk further away the pencil holder should every so often hold the pencil up vertically in front of them and compare it to the height of the tree. When the bottom and top of the pencil line up with the bottom and top of the tree, the person should stop moving.</li> </ol>
	If you don't have any trees to measure, we would like you to use either a ruler or a tape measure to measure items around the inside and outside of the house. In your maths book, we would like you to:
	<ol> <li>Choose an object to measure.</li> <li>Estimate the length of the object first and write that in your book.</li> <li>Then, measure it accurately and write that in your book too. How close were you?</li> <li>Find the difference in the measurements to calculate how close you were.</li> </ol>
