Today is World Creativity and Innovation Day – this got us thinking, if you could invent something new what would it be? Be as creative as possible.

Daily reading

Today, please read a book of your choice for 10 minutes. Can you predict what might happen in the story based on what has been read so far?

Top Tips:

Make sure you are reading a variety of fiction and non-fiction books. Can you identify how non-fiction texts are structured in different ways? e.g. contents page, sub-headings.

Discuss and clarify the meanings of any new words – could you have a pencil with you and note any words that you are unfamiliar with throughout the story?

Could you ring or facetime a family member and let them hear you read for 5 minutes?

Daily counting, number bonds or times tables

Try and work out the missing numbers to make 100, you can use a 100 square to help you.

$$60 + \underline{\quad} = 100$$

$$55 + \underline{\quad} = 100$$

$$12 + \underline{\quad} = 100$$

$$\underline{\quad} + 91 = 100$$

If these are tricky, write out the number bonds to 100 (e.g. $10 + 90 = 100$, $20 + 80 = 100$).
