Daily reading

Daily times tables

By the end of Year 3, you will need to know times tables up to 2, 5 and 10 (end of Year 2 expectations) 3, 4 and 8 (end of Year 3 expectations). You will need to spend time focusing on these using various websites or playing squirt as we talked about. Please use the <https://www.timestables.co.uk> website and the speed test to practise. If these are secure, please learn the related division facts.
The Year 3 team see this as really important learning so expect you to spend a minimum of 20 minutes a day learning your times tables.

If these are also secure, please learn other tables up to 12 x 12 and related division facts.

Daily Maths

WALT use Problem solving and reasoning:

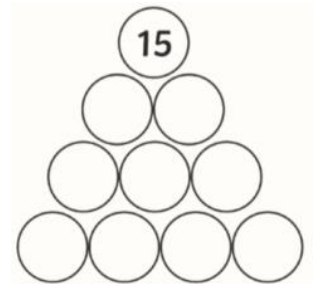
This might be a case of trial and error. Keep trying different combinations. Record all the workings in your books.

Ready: Choose 4 numbers to go at the bottom. Add the numbers in the joining circles and put the answer in the circle above. Can you make sure the last 2 numbers add to a total of 15?

Steady: Choose 4 numbers to go at the bottom, zero is not allowed. Add the numbers in the joining circles and put the answer in the circle above. Can you make sure the last 2 numbers add to a total of 15?

Go: Choose 4 numbers to go at the bottom, zero is not allowed. Subtract the numbers in the joining circles and put the answer in the circle above. Can you make sure the last 2 numbers subtract to make 15?

Challenge: Create one of your own with 5 circles on the bottom row.



Daily English

Re-tell a story verbally:

Yesterday you were introduced to our new enquiry '**What did the Greeks do for us?**'

During the Greek dark ages, some people earned a living with their storytelling skills. They went from town to town telling myths, fables and legends. A myth is a story about gods and goddesses and other mythical creatures. A fable is a very short story with a moral. A legend is a story about an event that happened in the past that might be true but that cannot be proven to be true.

Today, you will learn about a one of those stories – **Arachne and Athena**. Please read the link below or get an adult to read it to you. You might want to read it in two chunks as it's quite long. There is also a video to help you.
