Daily reading

Enjoy reading your book today for 10-15 minutes. Why not enjoy some tasty snacks as you get stuck into your book?

Today, we would like you to have a go at practising your summarising skills whilst you read.

Example questions to support summarising:

- Can you number these events 1-5 in the order that they happened?
- What happened after....?
- What was the first thing that happened in the story?
- Can you summarise in a sentence the opening/middle/end of the story?
- In what order do these chapter headings come in the story?

Top Tips:

- · Prior to reading, encourage your child to focus on the title of the book, the author, the illustrator and the front cover. Make predictions about what you think will happen in this book based on these factors. Afterwards, read the blurb and see if it gives you any further hints.
- · Continue asking your child questions throughout the book but also encourage them to ask questions as this will further their understanding of the text.
- · When you have finished the story, is your child able to retell the events in the order in which they happened? If you are reading non-fiction, can they recall any interesting facts that they have read?





Writing: This week in our writing, we are going to build up to writing a story set in Bath. Yesterday, you explored different areas of Bath. You wrote about different places and described them, thinking about what you saw, what you heard and how each place made you feel. You may have also taken photographs too which you can use today to help your writing. Today, we are going to use the work you created yesterday to write a setting description. You will need to choose the place in Bath where you'd like your story to be set in and describe it. Your story might be set in Victoria Park or at the Bath Abbey for example which you will describe. Try to write your setting description using the past tense. To make your writing really interesting, remember to include expanded noun phrases (the long, colourful grass) and similes in your description if you are able to. Similes are used to compare using like or as. You may also choose to include exclamation sentences within your writing too (these begin with 'what' or 'how'). Have a look at the inserts below to help you get started with your setting description. Example from a setting description: **Setting Description Checklist** It was shady and damp beneath the tall, Did I... colossal trees that blew in the wind. The say what can be seen? wide, open space in the park was enormous but there was not a single person in sight. As I strolled along, I enjoyed listening to the beautiful sound of a blackbird singing on a nearby branch. How peaceful this place was! Challenge – Have a go at using words that use the 'ful' suffix to apply your learning from the optional extra (see above) e.g. colourful. **Healthy Me** Time Challenge: – It's time to get healthy and build up your stamina! Are you ready? How many squat jumps can you do in 3 minutes? Can you ask an adult or someone in your household their favourite game? Can you enjoy playing this game together? Problem of the Build a park! Day Challenge – Today, your challenge is to design and build a park. Perhaps you might like to visit a park first to really see what different areas they have in them. You may even like to collect items you see as you wander around the park and use these to build it. Can you use just natural materials to build your park? Will you have swings and slides? What about an area to attract wildlife? Enjoy designing and building everybody! Today's riddle – How can you throw a ball as hard as you can, to only have it come back to you, even

if it doesn't bounce off anything?
