Good morning Year 1. Did you manage to guess the answer to yesterday's riddle? The answer was **your right elbow**. Did you know that your elbow is sometimes called your funny bone? It usually hurts more than it's funny and your elbow is not a bone at all! Here are some activities for you to do today.

Daily reading	<p>Today, please read a book of your choice for 10 minutes then spend 5 minutes retelling what you have read and answering questions about it. Please ask an adult to help you with this.</p> <p>Think about the book you are reading at the moment, is there anything you would change about the story?</p> <p>Optional online book - We can play - https://www.oxfordowl.co.uk/api/interactives/29255.html</p>												
Daily counting, number bonds or times tables	<p>Practise number bonds to 20 (e.g. $12 + 8 = 20$) Add 4 to any number under 18. E.g. $16 + 4 = ?$ $11 + 4 = ?$ $14 + 4 = ?$</p> <p>Challenge: Number bonds to 40. Keep numbers under 36.</p>												
Termly Spellings	<p>Please take time to learn spellings for future weeks and to re-visit past spellings. These can be found on the school website at https://www.newbridge.bathnes.sch.uk/ and go to the tab Classes and click on your class.</p> <p>You might want to try Rainbow writing to do this. Using coloured pencils in different ways can help to make parts of words memorable. You could highlight the tricky parts of the word or write the tricky part in a different colour. You could also write each letter in a different colour, or write the word in red, then overlay in orange, yellow and so on.</p>												
Daily Maths	<p>To be written in books: Problem Solving Activity: Length</p> <p>You will need: a ruler</p> <p>Look at the ruler and talk about how to use it, starting with zero. Are there 2 sides to your ruler? Find the centimetres – cm. It's time to go on a length hunt! Today, you are going to try and find 5 objects that you can measure using a ruler. Can you try and measure something longer than your ruler?</p>	Object	Length										
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Daily English/ Phonics	<p>Writing: The weather is something that can be different every day. For the rest of the week we'd like you to keep a weather diary. Each day, write about what the weather is like. You might like to write about the weather in the morning and the afternoon.</p> <p>Remember to include a capital letter, finger spaces and full stop for each sentence, think about including adjectives too. For example, a cold wind.</p> <p>Dictated sentence: Please read the sentence to your child. Then re-read slowly one word at a time while your child writes the sentence.</p> <p><i>Tim did the zip up on Bob's jacket.</i></p> <p>Extension – Can you extend your sentence using and/because/when?</p> <p>Copy the following real and alien words, then put sound buttons on them. Press the buttons to read the words.</p> <p>yad yell meast fried</p> <p>Play Quick Write. How many times can you write each word in a minute?</p> <p>you your they</p> <p>Optional game – https://www.phonicstracker.com/games/BellaTheBuilder/index</p> <p>Or feel free to pick another game from the website.</p>
Healthy Me	<p>BBC Super Movers – Homebros Level 1</p> <p>https://www.bbc.co.uk/teach/supermovers/just-for-fun-homebros-l1/z6cpwty</p>
Problem of the day	<p>Challenge – Can you build a tower? It could be tall, wide, brightly coloured or a tiny tower for an insect! Use Lego, blocks, recycling objects (make sure you check with an adult if they are clean and safe to use) to build your tower.</p> <p>Riddle of the day – What is black when it's clean and white when it's dirty?</p>
