Good morning Bee and Ladybird Class! Did you enjoy reading Quiz? Dad is funny isn't he?! Keep challenging yourselves and being super learners – we're very proud of you all! We hope you enjoy today's daily learning.

Daily reading

We hope that you were able to access this week's story, Quiz. (https://www.oxfordowl.co.uk/api/digital_books/1361.html) Today, have a go at sounding out the story yourself. If you are not sure, use the audio button to help you. If you are unable to access this eBook, please use the PDF version of the same story that we have attached for you.

Daily counting

Using both packs of number cards that you made yesterday, play snap! This is a very fun game that some of you may have played before. As a challenge, instead of saying "snap", you could say the number that you land on.

Tricky words

Please take time to learn your tricky words. These can be found in your learning pack that we have sent home. Concentrate on the words that you know you find tricky and choose a few words to practise each day. Here are some activities you may not have tried yet. Perhaps you could do one a day this week.

- Spread the tricky words out on the floor. Say a tricky word. Your child has to run and jump on the tricky word.
- Put all the tricky words inside a bag. Your child needs to pick one out and read it. If they're unsure, pop it back inside the bag ready for another try.
- Write the tricky word in writing pencil. Then go over the top with coloured pencil. Then with a felt tip pen. Then with a crayon! How many different things can you use to write the tricky word?
- Bury the tricky words in something like sand, soil, under rice, in slime! Pick one out and have a go at reading it!
- Speed Challenge! How many tricky words can you read in 1 minute?

Daily Maths

Today, we are going to begin by adding single digit numbers to the number 10. This is a practical activity which is best supported by Lego or something similar. On a piece of paper write "10 + 1 =" – ask your child to represent this using their Lego e.g. 10 pieces of Lego + 1 piece of Lego = 11 pieces of Lego. Keep repeating this until you get to 10 + 10 = 20. It is really important that your child can see that the number sentence represented, matches what they are doing with the Lego as we will revisit this later on in the week.

Daily English/Phonics

Phonics:
Today's sound is 'oi'.
Can you think of any 'oi' words yourself?
Write out these words in pre-cursive handwriting – coin, point, oink, ointment.
Can you circle the digraph 'oi' in each word? (e.g. key - 2 letters that make one sound)
Can you explain to your adult what a digraph is?
What does 'oi' look like in capital letters?

Writing:
Thank you for your clues, Miss Keane and Miss Mylan had fun guessing your animals!
Today, think of a topic you know lots about. It could be cars, or maybe animals. What words are used when writing a question? (Who, what, where, why, how). Write some questions about your topic. E.g. What car is the fastest? You will need to use your tricky word mat to help you use the right words in your questions. You could then test your family to see if they know the answers!
Remember capital letters, full stops, cursive writing and finger spaces!
