

Healthy Me

Make some food together:

Try these healthy-ish banana pancakes...

Ingredients:

1 large banana




2 medium eggs



a pinch of baking powder (gluten-free if coeliac)







	Method:
	 In a bowl, mash 1 large banana with a fork until it resembles a thick purée. Stir in 2 beaten eggs, a pinch of baking powder (gluten-free if coeliac) and a splash of vanilla extract. Heat a large non-stick frying pan or pancake pan over a medium heat and brush with ½ tsp oil. Using half the batter, spoon two pancakes into the pan, cook for 1-2 mins each side, then tip onto a plate. Repeat the process with another ½ tsp oil and the remaining batter. Top the pancakes with whatever you fancy. Miss Gatton had honey and raspberries, but Mrs Titchener had strawberries and maple syrup. Let us know what you decide!
