

Tuesday 9th June: Good morning Ladybird and Bee Class! What is the weather like today? Perhaps you could watch the weather on TV or on the computer! We hope you enjoy today's daily learning.

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| <p>Daily reading</p> | <p>We hope you enjoyed last week's book, 'Paddington at the Palace'. This week's book is 'Here We Are' by Oliver Jeffers. You can access it here: https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=cPPQdDwTUvE</p> <p>We will be basing some of our tasks on this book. Please email your teacher if you have any issues with accessing the book so we can provide an alternative source.</p> <p>Reading challenge of the day: Can you draw a character from your favourite book? You could even redesign the front cover.</p> |
| <p>Daily counting</p> | <p>The grown up should write down the days of the week and you should copy and then cut them up. Now that you have cut them up, can you put them in order? Use your days of the week song to support you!</p> |
| <p>Tricky words</p> | <p>Please take time to learn your tricky words. These can be found in your learning pack that we have sent home. Concentrate on the words that you know you find tricky and choose a few words to practise each day. Here are some activities you may not have tried yet. Perhaps you could do one a day this week.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Write the tricky word in as many different colours as you can! • Make the tricky word from play dough • Go on a tricky word hunt, by hiding them around one of the rooms in your house • Play tricky word snap, by having two copies of tricky words and matching them up • Call out a tricky word and your child has to point to them with a stick/wand, shoot them with a Nerf gun, or place a counter on them! |
| <p>Daily Maths</p> | <p>Explain to the children that today, you will be doing addition. The grown up will call out a number between 0 and 10. Ask the children to draw this number of shapes on a piece of paper. Ask them to draw the addition sign. Now, call out another number between 10 and 15 and ask the children to draw this. Ask the children to find the total number of objects on the sheet of paper. They must then draw an equals sign and write the answer down. Repeat this with different numbers.</p> |
| <p>Daily Phonics</p> | <p>Last week, we focussed on Phase 2 phonics, in particular, blending and segmenting words. This week, we are going to do the same, but using Phase 3 sounds.</p> <p>Revisit: Play a Phase 3 flashcard game, such as snap, quick recall or a sound hunt.</p> <p>Teach/Practise: Recap qu, ch, sh, th. Can you think of any words that use these graphemes?</p> <p>Apply: Write as many words beginning with those graphemes as you can.</p> |
| <p>Daily English</p> | <p>Make sure you have watched this week's story – Here We Are. In Ladybird and Bee Class, we are kind to our friends. Can you write some kind things about your friends? You could even draw a picture of you and your friends together. They might like it if you send it to them, share the kindness around!</p> <p>Super writers use: capital letters, full stops, finger spaces, cursive writing!</p> <p>Super writers can also use sound cards and tricky word mats to help them!</p> |

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| Healthy Me | Go outdoors. Use some sticks to create a frame and use as many natural objects as you can find to make a beautiful collage. |
| Daily Challenge | Look up a country that you know. Find 5 facts about that country. |
