Daily reading

Today, please read a book of your choice for 10 minutes then spend 5 minutes retelling what you have read and answering questions about it. Please ask an adult to help you with this.

Can you make up some questions to ask a grown up about the book you are reading? Can they answer them?

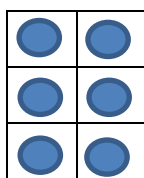
Multiplication – Arrays

You will need - 2p coins (or you can make them out of paper or cut them out of the sheet on yesterday's planning).

Today, we are going to make arrays to work out the total of a group.

Arrays are sets of objects arranged in rows and columns to make a rectangle. For example, egg boxes, muffin trays and ice cube trays. They can also be drawn.

The 6 eggs are arranged in 3 rows and 2 columns.

Make an array of five rows with two 2p coins in each row.

Draw the array in your book.

Copy and complete the sentences

There are ___ 2p coins in each row.

There are ___ rows.

There are ___ columns.

There are ___ coins altogether.

Show your working out $2 + 2 + 2 + 2 + 2 =$

There are 4 lots of 2, we can write this as $4 \times 2 =$

Repeat using arrays with 2, 5 or 10 objects in each row.

Keep your total under 25.

	<p>Challenge – There are twenty 2p coins in this array and five in each row. How many rows are there in the array? How could you change this array? How many rows have you got now? How many coins have you got in each row?</p>
<p>Daily English/ Phonics</p>	<p>Writing: If you can, please watch the video clip about seasons and weather – https://www.bbc.co.uk/bitesize/articles/zvfbgwX.</p> <p>If you are unable to watch the video clip please talk to an adult about, or research in another way, the different seasons and what the weather is like in each one.</p> <p>Now ask a grown up to draw a large circle in your writing book and divide it into quarters. Write the names of the seasons in order, one in each quarter. Now draw and label a weather picture to match each season.</p> <p>Dictated sentence: Please read the sentence to your child. Then re-read slowly one word at a time while your child writes the sentence.</p> <p><i>Bill has lost lots of bricks this year.</i></p> <p>Extension – Can you extend your sentence using and/because/when?</p> <p>Copy the following real and alien words, then put sound buttons on them. Press the buttons to read the words.</p> <p>joil soft stret trip</p> <p>Play Quick Write. How many times can you write each word in a minute?</p> <p>where love come</p> <p>Optional game – Help a Hedgehog https://www.ictgames.com/mobilePage/helpAHedgehog/</p> <p>Or feel free to pick another game from the website.</p>

Use Lego, blocks, recycling objects (make sure you check with an adult if they are clean and safe to use) to build something that rolls.</p> <p>Riddle of the day – What has words, but never speaks?</p>
