Tricky words

Daily English/Phonics

Phonics:

During the last week of term, we are going to revise and recap Phase 2 and 3 phonics in preparation for Year 1. Choose some of these activities to do each day.

- Sound Bingo**
- Sound Snap**
- Phonics Play games**
- Alphablocks**
- Write the sounds in rainbow colours**

	<p>Writing: Use the list you made to write your letter to your new teacher. Make sure it is in your best cursive writing so that you impress your new teacher!</p> <p>e.g. "Dear Ms Rhodes, I am 5 years old. I like painting. I like to eat toast. I love school. I am kind. From Sam"</p>
Healthy Me	Now that the parks are open, can you choose at least 3 things in the park/garden to create an obstacle course? Perhaps 10 swings, 3 times down a slide and up and down a climbing wall once. Can you set yourself a challenge as to how fast you can complete this?
Daily Challenge	Find a large area of grass somewhere nearby that you can walk to and make a long daisy chain. The adult can do the tying and the little one can do the finding if you need a sit down!
