Daily English/ Phonics

Writing:

Today and tomorrow our writing is linked to our learning in geography. We are thinking about hot and cold areas.

Don't worry if you can't, get your grown up to read the information below to you. Then talk about it.

	<p>Nigeria is a country in Africa. Its weather is usually hot all of the year. Nigeria is four times the size of the UK and lots of young people and children live there. Nigeria has some amazing places. There are busy cities, tropical rainforests, and river deltas full of crabs, fish, hippos and butterflies. Africa is the second biggest continent in the world. If you look closely at a map of Africa, you will count over 40 countries!</p> <p>Imagine you have travelled to one of the rainforests in Nigeria. In your book, draw a picture of it; include some of the animals and insects you think you'd find there. Now write some sentences to describe your rainforest. Remember to start each sentence with a capital letter, end with a full stop, and also include lots of lovely adjectives.</p> <p>If you have a globe at home, you might like to try and identify the hot areas and show them to a grown up or someone else in your family.</p> <p>Dictated sentence: Please read the sentence to your child. Then re-read slowly one word at a time while your child writes the sentence.</p> <p><i>Fishing is a kind of sport.</i></p> <p>Extension – Can you extend your sentence using and/because/when?</p> <p>Copy the following real and alien words, then put sound buttons on them. Press the buttons to read the words.</p> <p>longer tergur forget stroftam</p> <p>Can you put each of these common exception words into a sentence?</p> <p>she we no</p> <p>Optional game – You have played lots of different phonics games this term. Please pick your favourite game from - https://www.phonicsbloom.com/ to play today.</p>
Healthy Me	<p>Go Noodle – Knicky Knacky Knocky Knoo - https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=HMZqjfhKMZY</p> <p>Daisy Chain - Find a large area of grass somewhere nearby that you can walk to and make a long daisy chain. The adult can do the tying and the you can do the finding if the adult needs a sit down!</p>
Problem of the Day	<p>Challenge – Can you create a self-portrait? Use Lego, blocks, recycling objects (make sure you check with an adult if they are clean and safe to use) to create your self-portrait.</p> <p>Riddle of the day – You'll find me in Mercury, Earth, Mars and Jupiter, but not in Venus or Neptune. What am I?</p>
