# Daily counting, number bonds or times tables

This week, we will focus on knowing number bonds to 10 (or 20) without using resources to work them out. Children should be able to recall the answers quickly.

#### Number bonds that equal 10.

Use the number cards from Monday (0-10).

Deal 3 cards, include a pair of number bonds. E.g. 2, 6, 8

Children have to spot the pair that make 10.

Remember the focus is on knowing the answer and not challenging them to work it out.

What is at the top of the tank?


What is closest to the goldfish?
