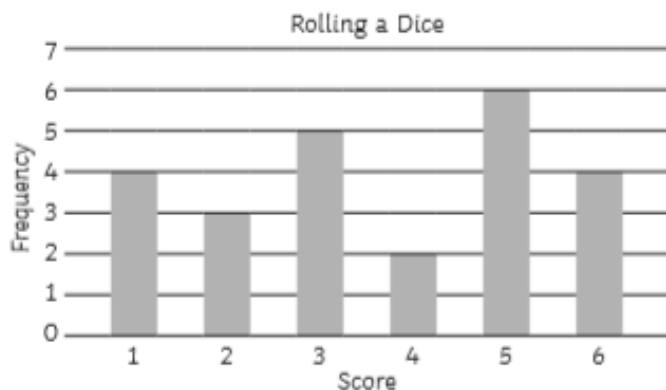

Task 3 – Writing a narrative:

★ Choose two or three of your favourite lines from your work yesterday

E.g. Rusted greed hissed inside his sick mind. Fiery obsession assembled within. Smoke-grey anger burned in his dark, suspicious eyes.

★ Now let's turn these into a short narrative. I find that it helps if you picture your villain in a setting that you know and can describe well (e.g. school hall, a shop, a park, etc.)

Modelled version:

Karlo scanned the foyer, a fiery obsession assembling within. It would soon all be his and there was nothing they could do to stop him. He chanced a quick look at his watch – 11:59.
