Daily English/	Writing:
Daily English/ Phonics	Writing: Today, we are going to write mini beast clue cards. We will use our learning about descriptive sentences and questions. You can either use your book to write in or a piece of paper. If you use paper, please fold it in half and keep it folded. First, pick a mini beast to write about but don't tell anyone what it is. On the outside you need to write a question sentence asking if anyone can guess your clues. For example 'What am 1?'  Next, on the inside of your folded paper, you need to write 2 or 3 clues describing the mini beast. Write each clue as a new sentence. Think back to the learning on Monday and remember not to include the name of the mini beast in your clues.  Finally, on the back, you can draw a picture of your mini beast and write the name of it too. Remember to include a capital letter, finger spaces and full stop for each clue sentence. Your question sentence will need a question mark instead of a full stop. You'll need to include adjectives in your clues too.  At the end share your clue card with a member of your family. Can they guess your mini beast from your clues?  Dictated sentence: Please read the sentence to your child. Then re-read slowly one word at a time while your child writes the sentence.  You can see clowns at a circus.  Extension — Can you extend your sentence using and/because/when?  Copy the following real and alien words, then put sound buttons on them. Press the buttons to read the words.  queet shuts strow hive  Use rainbow writing to practise spelling these common exception words. Try to spend about a minute on each word.
