Daily times tables

Year 3, you have been set a new topic on Maths with Parents. It is called **Exploring the 2, 4 and 8 multiplication tables**. Watch the video from Maths with Parents again. Write your 4 and 8 times tables out like this so you can start to see the pattern with doubling/halving the number

4x table

- $1 \times 4 = 4$
- $2 \times 4 = 8$
- $3 \times 4 = 12$
- $4 \times 4 = 16$
- $5 \times 4 = 20$
- $6 \times 4 = 24$
- $7 \times 4 = 28$
- $8 \times 4 = 32$
- $9 \times 4 = 36$
- $10 \times 4 = 40$



8x table

- $1 \times 8 = 8$
- $2 \times 8 = 16$
- $3 \times 8 = 24$
- $4 \times 8 = 32$
- $5 \times 8 = 40$
- $6 \times 8 = 48$
- $7 \times 8 = 56$
- $8 \times 8 = 64$
- $9 \times 8 = 72$
- $10 \times 8 = 80$

Mental maths:

Count in 4s backwards from different numbers.
27, 23, 19, 15
36, 32, 28, 24 etc

Understanding the value of coins:

3. Maurice the magpie has been stealing again!

He has stolen 3 silver coins.

What different totals could the coins make?



You can use the same coin amount more than once

For example: $20p + 20p + 20p = 60p$

Ready: – Can you find 5 different totals?

Steady: – Can you find 10?

Go: – 15? What is the biggest number you can make?

We'd like you to think about the boy in the picture.

- What's his whole name?
- How old is he?
- Where does he live? And who does he live with?
- What kind of house does he live in?
- Who are his best friends? What are they called?
- What are his hobbies?
- Where was he going before he was dragged off by the train?
- Who is the man in the picture with him? What is his name?

You can discuss this with someone or do a mind map drawing the boy in the middle. This will be a character profile. Be as creative as you like but you will be using him in a story at the end of the week so don't go too crazy.....
