| | - If you have already started the book, can you explain what has happened so far to someone? | |
| | - Can you make predictions about what might happen in the story based on what you have read | |

| | - Choose an adjective (a descriptive word) from your reading book. Can you think of three words that mean the same? E.g. Hot could also be boiling, sweltering or burning. Challenge yourself by having a go at using these words in sentences. | |
| | - Non-Fiction – Create a fun fact file using the information you have read about. Try to include the different features of non-fiction writing e.g. titles, subheadings, pictures and captions. | |
| | Top Tips: | |
| | - Prior to reading, encourage your child to focus on the title of the book, the author, the illustrator and the front cover. Make predictions about what you think will happen in this book based on these factors. Afterwards, read the blurb and see if it gives you any further hints. | |
| | - Continue asking your child questions throughout the book but also encourage them to ask questions as this will further their understanding of the text. | |
| | - When you have finished the story, is your child able to retell the events in the order in which they happened? If you are reading non-fiction, can they recall any interesting facts that they have read? | |
| Daily counting, number bonds or times tables | Who Wants to be a Millionaire? 1. Ask the children multiplication and division questions (focus on 2s, 5s and 10s) 2. Give them multiple choice answers 3. Allow them to use Phone a Friend/ 50/50 and Ask the Audience so that the children feel they are playing a game. | |
