Daily counting	Can you throw and catch a ball/beanbag/teddy 20 times? Can you throw and catch it more than 20 times? See how high you can count up to.

Tricky words	Please take time to learn your tricky words.
	These can be found in your learning pack that we have sent home.
	Concentrate on the words that you know you find tricky and choose a few words to practise each day.
	Here are some activities you may not have tried yet. Perhaps you could do one a day this week.  - Peg the tricky words on a line. Unpeg them and put them in a basket when you know them
	<ul> <li>Put the tricky words in a box. Rummage around and pick out a tricky word to read</li> <li>Write the tricky words on a label and stick them to a toy car. Draw some parking spaces with the matching tricky word on a piece of paper. Drive in the matching tricky word!</li> </ul>
	- Write the tricky word in lots of different sizes!
	- Chalk the tricky word on paper, chalkboard or paving.
Daily Maths	Yesterday, we continued to learn how to subtract single digit numbers. Today, there are two options for the Maths activity:
	1. Draw out a grid to 10 onto a large paved area outside. Ask your child to choose a number to stand on. Ask them to "subtract" or "take away" a number of your choosing. Your child has to move that number of steps backwards and tell you the answer.
	<ol> <li>Draw out a grid to 10 on a piece of paper. Ask your child to place a counter/small object on a number. Ask them to "subtract" or "take away" a number of your choosing. Your child has to move the counter/small object that number of squares backwards and tell you the answer.</li> </ol>
	To extend, can you write these as number sentences?
Daily	Phonics:
English/Phonics	Today's sound is 'ar'.
	Can you think of any 'ar' words yourself?
	Write out the words in pre-cursive handwriting – bar, card, yard, farm  Can you circle the digraph 'ar' in each word? (e.g. key - 2 letters that make one sound)
	Can you explain to your adult what a digraph is?
	What does 'ar' look like in capital letters?
