Daily reading

Give your child clues about animals that are featured in the story and see if they can guess which animal you are describing.

Daily counting

Today, you will only need one set of the number cards that you made on Monday. On a separate set of cards, we would like you draw and colour the correct number of objects to match each number. This is to ensure that your child understands the value of each number.

Tricky words

Please take time to learn your tricky words.
 These can be found in your learning pack that we have sent home.
 Concentrate on the words that you know you find tricky and choose a few words to practise each day. Here are some activities you may not have tried yet. Perhaps you could do one a day this week.

- Spread the tricky words out on the floor. Say a tricky word. Your child has to run and jump on the tricky word.
- Put all the tricky words inside a bag. Your child needs to pick one out and read it. If they're unsure, pop it back inside the bag ready for another try.
- Write the tricky word in writing pencil. Then go over the top with coloured pencil. Then with a felt tip pen. Then with a crayon! How many different things can you use to write the tricky word?
- Bury the tricky words in something like sand, soil, under rice or in slime! Pick one out and have a go at reading it!
- Speed Challenge! How many tricky words can you read in 1 minute?

Daily Maths

Today, you are going to use a tens and ones grid (an example is below.) Lego (or something similar) is an appropriate resource for this activity.



Using one set of your daily counting cards, we want you to shuffle them. One by one, turn each card over and show your grown up how you can represent this on your tens and ones grid. This will need modelling initially as it is a new concept to your children.

For example:

17 would have 1 ten (a stack of ten Lego pieces) and 7 ones (individual Lego pieces)

8 would have 0 tens and 8 ones (individual Lego pieces)

Keep repeating this until you have done all of the numbers from 1-20.

Daily English/Phonics	<p>Phonics: Today's sound is 'ear'. Can you think of any 'ear' words yourself? Write out these words in pre-cursive handwriting – hear, near, fear, tear Can you circle the trigraph 'ear' in each word? (e.g. <u>ma<u>ch</u></u> - 3 letters that make one sound) Can you explain to your adult what a trigraph is? What does 'ear' look like in capital letters?</p> <p>Optional game - https://www.bbc.co.uk/cbeebies/puzzles/alphablocks-school-words-quiz</p> <p>Writing: Miss Mylan and Miss Keane are setting you a quiz! See if you can write the answers to these questions in full sentences. If you are not sure, you can ask for help or use the internet. What animal has fluffy white wool and often lives in a field? How many days are in a week? Who does Mummy call when the 5 little monkeys fall off the bed? What shape has 2 long sides and 2 short sides?</p> <p>Remember capital letters, full stops, cursive writing and finger spaces!</p>
