Sportshall Athletics - County Finals: Following on from the success of winning the B&NES Large Schools' competition in October, this week the Year 6 team made their way to the University of the West of England to compete in the County Finals. 18 children took part in javelin, standing long jump and triple jump, chest push, standing vertical jump, speed bounce and relay races. Overall, the team came in the top half of the table, with the top three teams going through to the regional finals, out of 18 schools. The team, although a little disappointed, were pleased with their performances.

Year 6 Enquiry - 'What makes us human?'

Oscar and Evie have shared their of Science last week: experience On Monday we watched Mr Newman dissect a pig's heart. We learnt that a pig's heart is almost the same size as a human heart. When a heart stops working, you can use electric shocks to restart the heart. When the blood gets oxygenated for too long it turns darker. We looked at all the different chambers of the heart and we learnt that there are four chambers. At the end we were allowed to touch the pig's heart - one was dissected and one was not dissected.

This week, Year 1 had the most amazing Space Day! The children wowed us all with their alien, astronaut and other space costumes.

During Space Day, the children took part in various activities:

Learning about the life of Neil Armstrong and ordering events in his life.

Learning what is in space and ordering the planets in the solar system.

The children absolutely loved the day, not only learning about what is in space but how exciting it is for people to be exploring the moon and the universe.


















Year 5 Egyptian Day


















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
