Dear Parents and Carers,

Year 4 Assembly: Today, we were treated to another fantastic performance, as both Year 4 classes took to the stage to showcase their learning about the Romans. They captivated an audience of parents, carers and Upper School children with confidence, enthusiasm and talent. Watching them embrace the opportunity to perform, bringing history to life was inspiring and fun. A huge well done to Year 4 and a special thank you to Mrs Bartlett, Mrs Amor and Mrs Keep for coordinating a production involving all 60 pupils.

Improving pupil writing: A key aim of our School Development Plan this year has been to improve the quality of writing and its assessment. To support this, throughout the year we have enlisted the expertise of a writing consultant who continues to work closely with our teachers to refine planning and strengthen the assessment of writing. This week, our consultant spent two days in school, meeting with all of the teachers to review this development work. Outcomes show us that the teachers are confident in the new planning methods and that the pupils are benefiting from the new model of planning.

Quarter Final Match: On Monday, our boys' team travelled to Pensford for a cup match. The opposition was known to be challenging, but of course our boys were keen to do their best. It was a very tight match, with the opposition sneaking one goal. The boys and Mr Farrier should be very proud of their performance and how they handled this game. Well done, all.

Clubs finish this week: Thank you to all of the staff and providers who have led clubs in Term 3 and 4, affording the children opportunities beyond the school day. The clubs finish this week, until they recommence the w/b 28th April. The revised list has been sent out and sign-up will be available until **Tuesday 2nd April.** Children who are in receipt of funding for free school meals are eligible are to join fee paying clubs without charge.

OPAL: We are getting closer to understanding that our plans for a large sandpit can be a reality. 
Year I Robotics
