Dear Parents and Carers,

Upper School Sports Day 24: What a brilliant showcase Wednesday was. From the very start to the very end of the day, the Upper School children worked extremely hard. Taking images at school events and use of mobile phones: Please can I remind parents and carers that whilst it is permitted to take images at school events, no one else's child should be posted on social media.

In addition, if a parent or carer is working with a child in a volunteer capacity, personal mobile phones must be out of sight and not used at this time.

A further reminder, older children should only ever have their phone in school if it is absolutely necessary for their safety when walking to and from school. The phone must be turned off before entering the school site and handed in, immediately, to the receiving adult. At the end of the day, the phone is to be collected from the adult and not turned on until out of the school grounds. Parents and Carers cannot rely on using children's mobile phones to organise after school arangements. All messages in relation to a change in arrangements must be telephoned to the school office, to be passed to the child. I strongly advise that children do not bring mobile phones to school.

Well done to all involved!


