#### Dear Parents and Carers

Thank you for your support in all of our expectations. The children are responding well to being back at school and are rising to the challenges and responsibilities set. We feel very proud of all of the children and are excited to see their achievements over the coming weeks and course of the year.

Meet the Teacher meetings: Many thanks to the many parents who were able to come along for the Meet the Teacher sessions over the past two weeks. We have received positive feedback about these and are pleased they were helpful. In line with the information shared at these meetings, you will find the 'About Us' documents uploaded to the class pages on the website <u>here</u>. The Spelling Lists for Year 2 to Year 6 are also available on this page.

On 4<sup>th</sup>, 7<sup>th</sup> and 9<sup>th</sup> October the classrooms will be open after school from 3.20pm to 4pm for parents to view your child's learning. Following this, online teacher/parent meetings will take place on Thursday 10<sup>th</sup> and Tuesday 15<sup>th</sup> October. Details of how to book these meetings will follow.

**Punctuality:** It is a legal requirement for children to attend school regularly and also for children to be at school on time. The children must be in class for registration at 8.55am, meaning they need to be through the gates by 8.53am. Children arriving after 8.55am are marked as Late (L). Children arriving after 9.10am are marked as Unauthorised (U). If you are late, please make sure you sign your child in at the office.

Jonathan Jungle visits Year 4: Year 4 had such a fun and engaging learning opportunity this week when 'Jonathan Jungle' visited their classes. He brought with him some fascinating endangered species which the children learnt about and were able to hold. Jonathan Jungle's visit links with the class novel the year group are reading this term, The Explorer, and encourages the children to think about what kind of animals they might discover if they were to be an explorer.
