## AGM

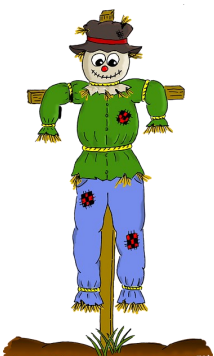

## 100 Club



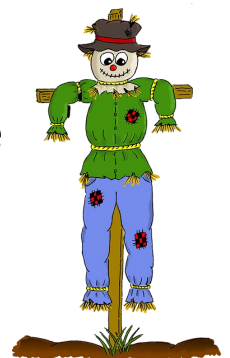
