Dear Parents and Carers

Our children: I am proud of all that our children across the school for all they have each achieved this year and thank them for their commitment to their learning and to our school community. A very special well done is to be given to our Ladybird and Bee Class pupils, who have completed their very first year at school.

Sadly, a number of children will leave our school today, other than our Year 6 cohort, as they move on to new schools and new houses. Our very best wishes go with Agnes, Aiden, Mia, Henry and Anwen, and their families. We had a special goodbye assembly on Thursday when the teachers and children spoke about their qualities and how they will be missed.

Our Year 6 pupils: Today is all about our Year 6 pupils as they fly the nest after up to seven years in our care. From four year olds in Reception to today, where they are ready to meet the next stage of their education at secondary school, it has been a privilege to see them through their Newbridge journey. There have been challenges, which we all know too well, but how the children have navigated these, and have risen to all that Year 6 demands of them, we know they are more than ready. We had the Year 6 Leavers' Tea and Disco. Last night with a photo booth, glitter designs, tattoos, pizza, cake and some very energetic dancing. Thank you to the Year 6 parents who planned and organised this, making it another memorable night. Today was the Year 6 Leavers' Assembly; an opportunity with families to recognise and celebrate each and every Year 6 pupil. Each child was presented with a Newbridge Leavers' 2024 hoody, kindly purchased by the NPSA. We are very proud of you all, Year 6, and we all wish you luck and happiness.

Our parents: With the pupils leaving, I need to acknowledge the families who will leave Newbridge, today. There are twenty nine families who will move on to pastures new. Some of these parents have had long associations with our school, having had multiple children attend. Some parents have played significant roles in the school's development and success, particularly as school governors and, or as, long serving members of the NPSA. Their commitment, care and enthusiasm is second to none and I thank each one for making our school so special and so successful; providing outstanding opportunities for the children across the curriculum and beyond. These are challenging times in education, yet, each day, they are provide their very best for every child and they should be very proud of their work and achievements.

Saying goodbye: We say goodbye to three of these staff members – Mrs Talley, Mrs Cuthbertson and Miss Cattrall, who will leave today. We wish them well in new ventures.

Key Stage 2 SATS Results 2024: We have received the provisional Year 6 SATs results. We are very pleased overall with these results though note that Writing produced the lowest outcome. We we were externally moderated in this area, as one of a sample of schools. We have a clear plan in place across next year to support development work in this area.

The last match of the year: In sweltering heat, our girls' football teams played away at WASPS after school yesterday. The girls were keen for a re-match with a heavy defeat last term. 


Year 5 work with SARI and The Newbridge Equalities Team (The NET)

Pupils in Class 5F and Class 5HB had the chance to work with Alex Phillips from SARI (Stand Against Racism & Inequality) on Monday this week. Alex delivered a workshop with the aims of raising awareness of the Equality Act 2010 and the *protected characteristics* within this. Pupils were taught to recognise examples of language that might constitute a hate crime and ways to speak respectfully and appropriately about race.

Both classes excelled within these sessions and demonstrated that they have an excellent level of understanding in this area. As a next step some pupils in the current Y3-5 classes will be invited to become part of The NET (Newbridge Equalities Team) and complete project work with a specific Equalities focus in the next academic year.

Two pupils in 5F have talked about the sessions with SARI.




Rufus: I enjoyed the traffic light activity where we had to sort the different examples of language into Acceptable, Unacceptable, and 'Depends.' For example, there were words like *dumb* and *lame* – it depends on who was saying it and what is being said. I liked it when Alex talked about Marcus Rashford and the abuse he suffered (to help us understand what constitutes a Hate Crime).

Thai: I think we can teach other pupils in the school about what we have learnt. It's not always about the intention of what you say it's about the impact that your words can have.
