Dear Parents and Carers,

I hope you have had a good week and feel up to speed as the term is now in full flow. Many congratulations to our EYFS children who have completed their induction period, demonstrating independence, a thirst for learning and how happy they are making new friends. Thank you very much to the parents and carers of the children for supporting the induction period and for working with new routines.

NPSA Picnic – today: The first NPSA community event of the year is happening today. The Newbridge Primary School Association has arranged a 'Back to School' picnic for parents and children to enjoy, together. If you are coming along, please be reminded to bring a bag to take any waste home for recycling. Also, to keep everyone safe, please ensure that parents/carers attending are responsible for their children at all times - children must stay in sight on the school field. Many thanks to all those who have made this event possible, led by our new Chair, Caroline Lovell. On Tuesday 23rd September, the NPSA will hold its first meeting of the year. This will be at 7.30pm, in the Blue Room in the Upper School. Everyone is very welcome to bring new ideas to support our children, our school and our community.

Roles and Responsibilities: I have mentioned before the importance we place on the children having roles and responsibilities. Having applied for 'jobs' in Year 6, the teachers have been sifting through the many, many applications. There are all sorts of important roles, which help to make our school day run smoothly, such as helping in the dining hall at lunchtime. Thank you to everyone who has stepped up to these areas of responsibility. House Captains and Sports Captains have also been identified in Year 6. Across the school, Class Ambassadors have been selected - this role involves representing the class to visitors. Thank you, and well done, everyone – I know you will complete your roles with pride.

Promoting our School Values: On a Monday, the whole school meets for an assembly. This provides a positive start to the week and is beneficial in exploring and promoting themes together. We have been focusing on our school learning values, which are: Learning and Communication, Creativity and Imagination, Personal Development, Collaboration and Citizenship. We have also promoted our school behaviour values, which everyone in our school community should follow – to be Respectful, Responsible and Safe. I expect your children will be able to tell you all about these, and what they understand by them.

Phonics Workshop and Book Fair: On Thursday 25th September a Phonics and Early Reading Workshop will be held for parents, with one session at 2.30pm and a repeated session at 5.15pm. Your support in further developing the children's skills at home will be greatly appreciated, so please do come along. The sessions are aimed at EYFS/KS1 parents, although anyone is welcome. To coincide with this, a Book Fair will be in school from Thursday 25th September to Tuesday 30th September.

Open Classrooms and Parent Teacher Meetings: On 3rd, 6th and 8th October the classrooms will be open after school from 3.20pm to 4pm for parents to view their child's learning. Following this, online Teacher/Parent Meetings will take place on Wednesday 15th and Tuesday 21st October. Details of how to book these meetings will follow.

Correspondence: At the moment, the school office is receiving a very high number of emails each day. While we always aim to respond within three school days, there may be times when it takes a little longer. To help manage responses more efficiently, we kindly ask parents to check the school website and newsletter first, as common questions and updates are shared here. Thank you for your patience and understanding; we appreciate your support as the office staff work hard to respond to everyone as quickly as possible.

Tours for prospective Reception children 2026: Looking ahead to our Reception intake for September 2026, thank you to everyone who has booked a session. We are now oversubscribed for all sessions however please keep a look out on the school website where we will release more dates soon.














Our Extra Curricular Programme
