#### Bath Blitz Walk – Year 6 Out and About

Class 6N and Class 6KR each took part in a Bath Blitz Walk, this week. Having walked to the centre of Bath, the classes were received by Adrian, who is a Mayor's Guide. He took the children around Bath City Centre, explaining the impact of the Blitz in Bath and pointing out the damage caused to buildings, and the restoration in later years. This enhances the current Year 6 enquiry, 'How do I cope in a crisis?'.

#### **Lower School Nativity Arrangements**

On Thursday 8<sup>th</sup> December and Friday 9<sup>th</sup> December, we will hold the Lower School Nativity performances. Each year, Year 2 pupils lead the performance and act out a short play, with plenty of singing. On 8th December, Class 2M will be the actors and Class 2R will be the choir. This arrangement will reverse for the Friday. On each day, the Year 1 and Reception classes will join in with the performance, by singing a song or performing a dance. Therefore, for Year 1 and Year 2 parents, it will not matter which performance you attend, unless you have a child in Year 2, and wish to come on the day they are acting. Tickets will not be issued for these performances; instead, parents should wait after drop off or return for 9.30am, to queue at the back door of the Upper School hall.

On Wednesday 14<sup>th</sup> December, the Lower School will visit Emmanuel Church on Apsley Road. Year 2 children will complete a simple nativity, and all of the Lower School will join with songs they have learnt. Parents are welcome to attend, but please know it will be a bit of a squeeze.

#### **Upper School Christmas Music Concert**

This will take place on Wednesday 14<sup>th</sup> December at 7pm and Thursday 15<sup>th</sup> December at 10am. In this, the choir will perform, along with other musical items. More details about these concerts will follow, but please know parents and carers are welcome at either performance.

The choir will aso be singing at the RUH on Friday 25<sup>th</sup> November and at the School Christmas Fair on Friday 2<sup>nd</sup> December. Year 6 members of the choir will again sing at Stratton House Residential Home, on Friday 9<sup>th</sup> December.










### Year 4 had fun in Forest School playing Stratego and using secateurs

At Newbridge we have marked Anti-Bullying Week with a whole school assembly and further conversations about our role in tackling bullying and other unpleasant incidents. In selecting this theme, the Anti-bullying Alliance stated: "Reach Out came about as staff and children wanted a theme that empowered them to do something positive to counter the harm and hurt that bullying causes. 
