It was 5 years ago, yesterday, that we closed the school for the first time - a day I will never forget. I am sure it, and all that Covid-19 brought, has left a lasting memory in your minds, too. I remain grateful for all that the staff and school community did at that time during a time of such uncertainty. Seeing the school as vibrant and successful as it is today is testament to the care, commitment and resilience of our special community.

The Bath Half: We wish to thank and celebrate the staff and parents who took to the streets on Sunday to run the Bath Half Marathon. To commit to the training is a huge undertaking, and then to run the race, raising funds for the NPSA is a significant effort all of the runners should be proud of. Thank you, and well done to Mr Newman, Mr Hollis, Mr Goldsmith, Mrs Wright, Mrs Taylor, Mr Sadar, Mrs Bell and Mr Banks.

The combined efforts, with Gift Aid, will raise approximately £6500, supporting our children, our school and our community. This is incredible – and we are truly grateful to you all, thank you.

Bee Class Assembly: Well done to all of Bee Class and Miss Hill for their first class assembly, performed this afternoon. Thank you to the many parents and carers who came along to support the children and enjoy the show. We were reminded of what is important about being a Newbridge citizen, and were entertained by an insight into life in EYFS. The children performed with pride and with so much confidence. It was a brilliant and fun end to another fantastic week. Well done, all.

Year 6 to Life Skills: On Monday, all of our Year 6 pupils had an exciting visit to Lifeskills in Bristol, where they took part in a series of hands-on scenarios designed to teach vital life skills The children encountered real-life situations such as making emergency 999 calls, identifying hazards in the home, learning about road and fire safety and understanding the importance of personal responsibility. The session was not only informative but also great fun, and the pupils left feeling more confident about how to stay safe and make sensible choices in the wider world. A big thank you to the Lifeskills team for an invaluable learning experience, and also to our NPSA who generously funded the visit.

OPAL: We are well on our way through the 18 month journey to set out all of the OPAL objectives and actions. Last week, the OPAL working group attended a further session with our OPAL mentor, this included training for the lunchtime support staff around risk benefit. With this, we will start to move towards different types of play and consider how other parts of our site can be used. Encouraging children to take managed risks—whether climbing, balancing or using loose parts creatively, helps them develop resilience, problem solving skills and confidence. Through OPAL, our aim is to support children in making informed choices about risk while reaping the benefits of adventurous and imaginative play. We will update you further when we move into this next stage. In the interim, we are working on an exciting project – to build a large, beach-themed sandpit between the Upper School and the Lower School, at the bottom of the field. This needs a little more planning, but we are keen to achieve this as soon as possible. Thank you for your ongoing support with all we have achieved in OPAL so far. It remains a big hit!

Our NPSA: Thank you to those who attended the meeting on Tuesday evening. As ever, there was much positive planning, looking into the Spring and Summer Term events. Tonight, is our annual Quiz Night. This always proves to be a fun evening, and is a firm favourite on the school calendar. Sincere thanks to Neil Clews who has again stepped forward to plan and organise the evening. Following on, there will be a Cake and Uniform Sale on Friday 28th March, and an Easter Egg Hunt on Friday 4th April. Also look out for the 'Decorate an Egg' Competition.

'Express Yourself' Day: On Friday 4th April, the children are invited to take part in 'Express Yourself Day', in return for a donation for the NPSA. Children can wear their own clothes, dye their hair, wear nail varnish, etc. All clothing and shoes must be safe and appropriate. If children choose not to take part, this is of course fine.

No Nut Policy (Nut Aware School): Please can all parents and carers note that we have a 'no nut policy'. This means that there cannot be any food items on site which contain nuts, for children to access.

Defibrillators on site: Please be aware that there are three defibrillators on our school site, for anyone to access in an emergency. They are kept in each of the Medical Rooms in the Upper School and the Lower School and there is also one in the main office.

The children behaved very well and responded politely and sensibly to all that we asked of them.











'It was interesting to find out about things we don't usually know or encounter – for example, it takes a car travelling over 20mph, 30 plus metres to react and stop'.
