Dear Parents and Carers,

NPSA Picnic – what a lovely evening it was: If you were able to come along to the NPSA Picnic last Friday, I am sure you will have had a lovely time. It was all about community, with many families enjoying the weather, refreshments and music. Thank you very much to all involved in making the evening possible, and a big shoutout to The Electric Bear who generously loaned their pop-up bar for the evening.

Our first NPSA meeting of the year took place on Tuesday led by Caroline Lovell, our new Chair. There was a good turnout both in person and remotely. The NPSA is hugely important to our school – it is the glue that holds us together, so that we thrive as a very special community. So, thank you to all who attended. The next event is next weekend, with a Scarecrow Trail organised for next Sunday 5th October. A QR code will be available next week to access the map. Sincere thanks to all of the families who are busy making scarecrows, and to Helen Slade and Stuart Matthews for organising this fun event.

Parent/Teacher Meetings: A letter was sent out today informing parents how to sign-up for an online Parent/Teacher Meeting via School Cloud. The meetings are being held on Wednesday 15th and Tuesday 21st October, and we encourage every family to make one appointment per child. Mr Bacon, our Special Educational Needs Coordinator, will be available on one of the evenings. The booking system will be live from Wednesday 1st October at 7pm and will close at 7pm on 8th October. There are reasons for the meetings being online – parents can join from different locations, every parent's meeting is the same length and this system supports teacher workload. Again, please know that parents and carers do not need to wait until the parent/teacher meeting to raise concerns, an appointment can be requested with the teacher at any time, via the school office.

Open Classrooms: On 3rd, 6th and 8th October the classrooms will be open after school from 3.20pm to 4.00pm. This is an opportunity for parents and carers to view pupil books and the classroom environment. There is no need to book for these sessions, we just ask that all visitors are respectful of the class environment and resources.

Attendance Matters: Parents and Carers have a legal duty to ensure their child attends school, on time, each day, and there are only a small number of circumstances when missing a school day is permitted, e.g. sickness. School leaders will decide what counts as an exceptional circumstance when authorising absence, however holidays are rarely an acceptable reason for an absence and are very unlikely to be treated as an exceptional circumstance. Please read below for when fixed penalty notices may be issued for school absence.

Phonics Workshop and Book Fair: On Thursday 25th September a Phonics and Early Reading Workshop was held for parents. Thank you to all who came – we were pleased with the turn-out. If you were not able to attend, the information shared has been uploaded to our school website <u>here</u> and to Google Classroom.

Correspondence: The school office continues to receive a very high number of emails each day. While we always aim to respond within three school days, there may be times when it takes a little longer. To help manage responses more efficiently, we kindly ask parents to check the school website and newsletter first, as common questions and updates are shared here. Thank you for your patience and understanding; we appreciate your support as the office staff work hard to respond to everyone as quickly as possible.

Tours for prospective Reception children 2026: Looking ahead to our Reception intake for September 2026, thank you to everyone who has booked a session. We have now added more dates so please book on via on the school <u>website</u>

OPAL – Outdoor Play and Learning: We are delighted to be on our OPAL (Outdoor Play and Learning) journey, transforming playtimes for all our children. This week, staff took part in further training, with three more sessions planned this term. The benefits of OPAL are so evident. Children are more active, creative and collaborative in their play. They are developing social skills, building resilience and discovering new ways to enjoy the outdoors together. Most importantly, they are having fun – playtimes have never been so enjoyable! We are delighted with the positive impact OPAL is having on our school community and we look forward to sharing more updates as the journey continues.

Our Newbridge Curriculum

We believe the Newbridge Curriculum should provide our children with an **engaging**, **creative and purposeful** opportunity to make **connections** in their knowledge alongside developing each of them as future citizens of our community and beyond. The **progressive** and **sequenced** nature of our **broad** and **relevant** curriculum allows for children to be **challenged at all levels** and is inherently based on our values of **Learning and Communication**, **Creativity and Imagination**, **Personal Development**, **Collaboration** and **Citizenship**.

Subject Leaders have worked on 'Curriculum Progression Threads' for each of their subjects. 'Threads' are the golden, traceable pieces of learning and skills that develop over time. They are evident in each subject, each year. For example, in History, Chronology (ordering things by time) is one of the 'Threads' - using our new approach you can track how this skill is developed year on year. These documents are available on our school website. From now on, foundation subject lessons will link to these 'Threads' and will become a common language for the children.

Fixed Penalty Notice

If your child misses school because of an unauthorised absence of 10 sessions (or 5 days), the school may issue penalty notices.

Penalty notices will be issued separately to each parent, and for each child. The fine for each penalty notice is £120, with 28 days to pay. If you pay within 21 days, the fine is reduced to £60 for each penalty notice.

For example, a family with two parents (1&2) and two children (A&B) taking unauthorised absence would receive the following penalties:

- Parent 1 = 1 penalty for child A plus 1 penalty for child B = 2 penalties
- Parent 2 = 1 penalty for child A plus 1 penalty for child B = 2 penalties
 Total payable by the family = 4 penalties (or £480).

If the family in this example had paid their fine within 21 days of being issued the penalty notice, they would have had to pay £240.


