Welcome

Extra-Curricular Activities

Absence in term time and puntuality

Please know that absence in term time will only be authorised in exceptional circumstances. All absence requests must be completed two weeks in advance, when this is possible. All absence requests must be completed using the online form, to which a response will be sent in return. Children who are not in class for registration at 8.55am will be marked as Late (L) and Unauthorised (U) after 9.10am.

Respiratory infections and Group A Streptococcus (GAS)

Respiratory infections are common, particularly during winter months, with symptoms caused by a number of respiratory infections including the common cold, COVID-19, flu and respiratory syncytial virus (RSV). Symptoms can include a runny nose, high temperature, congestion, cough and sore throat. Children with a high temperature and who are unwell should stay off until they no longer have a temperature and are well enough to attend school. Children with mild symptoms, such as a runny nose, sore throat or mild cough, who are otherwise well, can continue to attend.

If your child has a diagnosed case of impetigo, scarlet fever, strep throat, chicken pox or flu, please continue to report this to enquiries@newbridge.bathnes.sch.uk Please remain vigilant and seek medical advice whenever you are concerned about your child's health, or your own.

Please refer to the information at the end of this newsletter, detailing when a child should be absent from school, and for how long.

Should I keep my Child Off School?



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Chickenpox	at least 5 days from the onset of the rash and until all blisters have crusted over	
Diarrhoea and Vomiting	48 hours after their last episode	
Cold and Flu-like illness (including COVID-19)	they no longer have a high temperature and feel well enough to attend. Follow the national guidance if they've tested positive for COVID-19.	
Impetigo	their sores have crusted and healed, or 48 hours after they started antibiotics	
Measles	4 days after the rash first appeared	
Mumps	5 days after the swelling started	
Scabies	they've had their first treatment	
Scarlet Fever	24 hours after they started taking antibiotics	
Whooping Cough	48 hours after they started taking antibiotics
