Spellings update

We are constantly looking to improve how we teach phonics and spelling. The Phonics Bug programme in the Lower School is an excellent teaching tool and we wanted similar support with spelling in Year 2 and Key Stage Two.

From next week, the children in Year 2 to Year 6 will be using a programme called Spelling Shed which has a targeted progression of spelling patterns and sounds. We hope this will support children and consolidate the many spelling rules in English.

We have also changed how we approach spelling at home. There will no longer be a spelling test on a Friday. Research shows us that this is not the best way to embed spelling knowledge. The spelling lists that you will see come home are a guide to the spelling patterns that are being taught in school. We would love for you to support your child to investigate other words with that particular pattern, maybe searching for them in reading books.

The School Library

Thank you to all of our volunteers who ensure the library is available to all. Please read on to find out about some exciting activities planned in the near future.

Absence in term time and puntuality

Please know that absence in term time will only be authorised in exceptional circumstances. All absence requests must be completed two weeks in advance, when this is possible. All absence requests must be completed using the online form, to which a response will be sent in return. The form can be found on the school website here Absence Request Form. Children who are not in class for registration at 8.55am will be marked as Late (L) and Unauthorised (U) after 9.10am.

It is the recommendation of Bath and North East Somerset that our school issues Fixed Penalty Notices and this matter is currently being considered by the Governing Body. Children have a legal right to be in school and to receive an education. According to set criteria, if pupils accumulate unauthorised absence or late marks, a Fixed Penalty Notice can be issued. In a desire to give advance notice of this, please also note that absence due to holidays will be coded as unauthorised except in exceptional circumstances.

Residents Parking

Following public consultations for a Residents' Parking Zone (RPZ), B&NES has decided to introduce this in Charmouth Road, Lyme Road and Lyme Gardens, from **20th February**. Please study this map Charmouth Road, Lyme Road and Lyme Gardens Resident Parking to understand the restrictions that will be put in place. This map shows that there will be some parking available on Charmouth Road, for a period of up to 30 minutes. Please also view the

<u>Schedule of Works</u> to understand the timescales and the introduction of the restrictions.

Whilst we recognise that parking on the roads around school is difficult, please can I ask that parents and carers do not get involved in angry exchanges about this. It has been reported that children have been present at such times, which will be unsettling and does not reflect the values we promote in school.

Term dates and the school calendar








Year 3 have been practising their gymnastics skills by using tuck, star and straight jumps.





Year 3 have also been exploring multiplication by 2 digits using place value grids and partitioning. What amazing mathematicians we have in Year 3.





Should I keep my

child off school?



Until...

Chickenpox	at least 5 days from the onset of the rash and until all blisters have crusted over
Diarrhoea and Vomiting	48 hours after their last episode
Cold and Flu-like illness (including COVID-19)	they no longer have a high temperature and feel well enough to attend. Follow the national guidance if they've tested positive for COVID-19.
Impetigo	their sores have crusted and healed, or 48 hours after they started antibiotics
Measles	4 days after the rash first appeared
Mumps	5 days after the swelling started
Scabies	they've had their first treatment
Scarlet Fever	24 hours after they started taking antibiotics
Whooping Cough	48 hours after they started taking antibiotics



but make sure you let their school or nursery know about...

Hand, foot and mouth	Glandular fever
Head lice	Tonsillitis
Threadworms	Slapped cheek
