Dear Parents and Carers

It is usually during this term that we notice children making increased progress and this is certainly what is being said around the school. The teachers continually look to find new and exciting ways to engage pupils in their learning and we are proud of the broad and balanced offer our school provides the children, enabling progress of the whole child.

British Values and Feel Good Friday: Today's focus across the school was on the British Values. All schools are required by law to promote the fundamental British Values of:

- Democracy;
- The rule of law;

- Individual liberty;

- Mutual respect, and
 - Tolerance of those with different faiths and beliefs.

Whilst the British Values may not always be explicity taught, it is evident, when referring to DfE guidance, that at Newbridge we teach and promote the values across all aspects of school life. The DfE guidance states that we should enable students to: develop their self-knowledge, self-esteem and self-confidence; distinguish right from wrong and to respect the civil and criminal law of England; encourage pupils to accept responsibility for their behaviour, show initiative, and to understand how they can contribute positively to the lives of those living and working in the locality of the school and to society more widely; enable pupils to acquire a broad general knowledge of and respect for public institutions and services in England; further tolerance and harmony between different cultural traditions by enabling pupils to acquire an appreciation of and respect for other people; and encourage respect for democracy and support for participation in the democratic processes.

Next week ,will will share some of the explicit learning that has taken place today.

Year 2 are welcomed to Oldfield School: Through our strong links with Oldfield School, all of the Year 2 children visited on Wednesday for an active PE session. The children were led by the Oldfield Sports Ambassadors, who were excellent in encouraging the children to practice a range of sporting skills.
