Absence in term time and puntuality

Please know that absence in term time will only be authorised in exceptional circumstances. All absence requests must be completed two weeks in advance, when this is possible. All requests must be completed using the online form, to which a response will be sent in return. The form can be found on the school website <u>here</u>. Children who are not in class for registration at 8.55am will be marked as Late (L) and Unauthorised (U) after 9.10am. It is the recommendation of Bath and North East Somerset that our school issues Fixed Penalty Notices and this matter is currently being considered by the Governing Body. Children have a legal right to be in school and to receive an education. According to set criteria, if pupils accumulate unauthorised absence or late marks, a Fixed Penalty Notice can be issued. In a desire to give advance notice of this, please also note that absence due to holidays will be coded as unauthorised except in exceptional circumstances.

Dogs on site and at the gate

Please note that dogs are not allowed on the school site at any time, this includes being carried. Please can I ask that dogs are not tied to the railings, as to block the pavement in and out of school.
