Dear Parents and Carers

Thank you for your commitment to all we set out to achieve at our school. We are aware that school life is very busy and that this takes much organisation and support by parents. We do thrive on being a busy, bustling school – with many rich experiences, and we are grateful for your support in making this happen.

Staffing update: Please be aware of some changes in our staffing team. Following Mr Seaborne's retirement as a specialist PE teacher, we are delighted to welcome Mr Wallace, who will assume this role from the start of Term 4. Mr Wallace has demonstrated his skill, experience and knowledge in teaching PE and sport and we know that he will be an asset to our staff team and the children's access to high quality lessons and acrtivities. Many of you will know Miss Gatton who taught in Year 5 last year. She has now made the difficult decision to resign from her teaching role at Newbridge. We are all saddened to see her leave – she was a highly respected member of our staff and an excellent teacher. In exciting news, Miss Gatton is expecting a baby which is due in May. We all wish Miss Gatton and her partner every future happiness. Mrs Berridge commences maternity leave today and we are very excited to soon hear about the arrival of her second child. Our very best wishes are with her, her husband and daughter, Mrs Derrien will replace Mrs Berridge from next week and we welcome her to our staff team in this capacity.

British Values: Last Friday's focus across the school was on the British Values. All schools are required by law to promote the fundamental British Values of: Democracy; The rule of law; Individual liberty; Mutual respect, and Tolerance of those with different faiths and beliefs. Please see below for some of the learning associated with these values, supporting the children's understanding more explicitly.

Key Stage 1 SATs: The end of KS1 national curriculum assessments are now non-statutory and as a school we will not be completing them. Following the Government's response to the 2017 consultation on primary assessment, the DfE announced that assessments at the end of KS1 would become non-statutory from this academic year. The Reception Baseline Assessment (RBA) now replaces the end of KS1 assessments, which became statutory in the academic year 2021 to 2022, and the Reception cohort from that year reach the end of KS1 in the academic year 2023 to 2024.

Gymnasts represent Newbridge: Our Year 5 and Year 6 gymnastics team competed at a tournament at Baskerville's on Tuesday afternoon. Mrs O'Gara prepared the team with their routines and was proud of all of the performances and the children's conduct. Well done, team, for all of your achievemnts. Year 4 compete in Tag Rugby: Well done to all of the Year 4 pupils who represented Newbridge, today, at the STAR tournament held at Walcot Rugby Club. We will have a report next week.



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

THE BRITISH VALUES


