Year 1 Space Day: If you had chance to glimpse sight of the wonderfully created alien and space outfits worn by Year 1 earlier this week, you too would have been so impressed. The children had great fun and were excited to role-play and learn about constellations and the solar system. 




Year 5 Egyptian Day

On Tuesday, Year 5 enjoyed an incredibly immersive Ancient Egyptian day, during which they were able to sample Egyptian cuisine, create pottery, learn about the mummification process and produce models of inventions created thousands of years ago.



The day began with the children

working together in teams to prepare the ingredients needed to create a delicious Egyptian mezze. Each group sliced onions, garlic and tomatoes, before they added lemon juice and cumin. The mixture was then combined with chickpeas and simmered in a tomato sauce. The children enjoyed the dish with warm flatbreads!



After break, the children began designing their own canopic jars in the image of one of the four 'sons of Horus'; Imsety, Hapy, Duamutef, and Qebehsenuef. Whilst the children produced their work using air drying clay, they learned about the significance of each god and how the gods related to the different organs found within the human body.

At various points during the day, the children took part in a range of other activities linked to Ancient Egypt including; assembling a pharaoh mask, creating a death mask for a fish and constructing a paper model of a shaduf.

In the afternoon, the children observed Pharaoh Handson mummifying a fish; talking the children through each step of the process as he treated the body with natron salt, Nile water and magical amulets, before the fish was stuffed and wrapped in linen. It was explained that the four different canopic jars were used to hold certain organs that were removed during the process. Finally, the children



were also introduced to "Tuna-Khamun" a previously mummified fish, who is now celebrating his 10th birthday!

Year 1 Space Day

On Monday we had Space Day in Year 1. First we ordered the solar system. Then we were training like an astronaut. My favourite activity was making the saucers.
