Whilst our Feel Good Friday today was featured around 'Healthy Me', a new Jigsaw unit of work, we wanted to feel good about helping others. We have used the day to offer our support to those affected by the earthquake, and because we have Turkish and Syrian families in our school community. By completing laps of the field and the playground, through your generous donations we have so far raised £704.81 for the Disasters Emergency Committee, which is more than incredible! Today also marks the first anniversary of the invasion of Ukraine and we are equally mindful of this. Our thoughts are with those who have lost their lives and who have needed to flee their homes. We are especially mindful of the plight of the Ukrainian families in our school community.

A focus on Spelling

Since last term, we have changed how we approach spelling at home. Year 5 and Year 6 pupils will continue with a weekly test, as this will be required in the end of Key Stage 2 assessment for English. The spelling lists that you will see on the website, for your child's class, are a guide to the spelling patterns that are being taught this term. We would like you to support your child to investigate other words with these particular patterns, maybe searching for them in reading books. 

Should I keep my Child Off School?



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Chickenpox	at least 5 days from the onset of the rash and until all blisters have crusted over	
Diarrhoea and Vomiting	48 hours after their last episode	
Cold and Flu-like illness (including COVID-19)	they no longer have a high temperature and feel well enough to attend. Follow the national guidance if they've tested positive for COVID-19.	
Impetigo	their sores have crusted and healed, or 48 hours after they started antibiotics	
Measles	4 days after the rash first appeared	
Mumps	5 days after the swelling started	
Scabies	they've had their first treatment	
Scarlet Fever	24 hours after they started taking antibiotics	
Whooping Cough	48 hours after they started taking antibiotics
