Punctuality

It is not only a legal requirement for children to attend school regularly, but also for children to be at school on time. The children must be in class for registration at 8.55am, meaning they need to be through the school gates by 8.53am. Children arriving after 8.55am are marked as Late (L). Children arriving after 9.10am are marked as Unauthorised (U).

Many of the usual events are in the pipe-line, incuding the Fun Run, the Summer BBQ/Hog Roast and the Summer Fair. These are only happening because parents have stepped forward to lead on them. We will be very grateful for volunteers to ensure these events run smoothly, so please contact your class representative, if you wish to help and het involved. Thank you to the organisers of the cake sale and the uniform sale, yesterday, and to all of those who made donations. A total of £278 was raised.

Playground Improvements

Work has continued on the playground areas again this week. If using the Charmouth Road entrance, you will have seen the fantastic new surface being laid. The weather has again hampered progress, however it has already transformed this tired looking area. A new wooden train will be fitted and, over time, we hope to be able to purchase loose play equipment to be sited here. The project continues at the Upper School, but again the rain has slowed down this work, too. We hope it will be completed next week.

Defibrillator

Please be aware that there are two defribillators on our school site, for anyone to access in an emergency. They are kept in each of the Medical Rooms – one in the Upper School and one in the Lower School.

Diarrhoea and Vomiting

When children are ill with sickness and diarrhoea they must remain absent until 48 hours after the last episode. We are currently seeing high numbers of sickness in some year groups, and wish to prevent this as much as possible. All year groups are continuing to promote good handwashing routines and ventilate spaces.

Before the end of term, please check through the large amount lost property in the Upper School cloakroom and the blue box in the Lower School hall.





Should I keep my Child off School?



Chickenpox	at least 5 days from the onset of the rash and until all blisters have crusted over
Diarrhoea and Vomiting	48 hours after their last episode
Cold and Flu-like illness (including COVID-19)	they no longer have a high temperature and feel well enough to attend. Follow the national guidance if they've tested positive for COVID-19.
Impetigo	their sores have crusted and healed, or 48 hours after they started antibiotics
Measles	4 days after the rash first appeared
Mumps	5 days after the swelling started
Scabies	they've had their first treatment
Scarlet Fever	24 hours after they started taking antibiotics
Whooping Cough	48 hours after they started taking antibiotics
