Dear Parents and Carers,

I hope you've had a good week. School life is going really well, and continues to be very busy.

**B&NES Cross Country Championship:** Read on to find out about the performance of Year 5 and Year 6 pupils at the annual B&NES Cross Country Championship held on Wednesday, this week. It was a privilege to watch them take part, with gutsy performances from all competitors.

Year 6 out and about: Our first out of school visit took place today. The Year 6 children travelled to Yeovilton to the Fleet Air Arm Museum, to immerse themselves in the history of WW11 as part of their enquiry, 'How can we learn from the past?' We look forward to hearing all about the visit in next week's newsletter.

**Open Classrooms:** The classrooms will be open to all parents from 3.20pm to 4.00pm today, and on Monday 7<sup>th</sup> October and Wednesday 9<sup>th</sup> October. This is an opportunity for parents and carers to view pupil books and the classroom. There is no need to book for these sessions and we politely ask that all visitors are respectful of the class environment and resources.

**Parent/Teacher Meetings:** Please remember to book your appointment to meet with your child's class teacher online on Tuesday 10<sup>th</sup> or Thursday 15<sup>th</sup> October. The booking system will close at 4pm on Tuesday 8<sup>th</sup> October. Mr Bacon, our Special Educational Needs Coordinator, will be available on alternative dates which are Tuesday 12<sup>th</sup> and Tuesday 26<sup>th</sup> November. Please know that parents do not need to wait for a Parents' Evening in order to talk with the class teacher about a concern or progress. Parents are able to request a meeting with their class teacher at any point in the school term, and we encourage this.

Valuing Difference: We always strive to create a rich and inclusive environment for our pupils. With this in mind, we are having a Valuing Difference Day on Friday 18th October. We want the children to appreciate the many ways in which people's backgrounds, abilities and experiences contribute to the richness of the world we live in. To make this day memorable, we are seeking volunteers from our community to share their own stories. We are particularly interested in hearing from individuals who are from an ethnic minority, live with a disability or have overcome significant adversity. A session would only need to last around 30 minutes and would involve sharing your story to one of our year groups and answering some questions from the children. Ideally, we would have a different volunteer for each year group. If you are interested in participating or know someone who might be, please contact the office by Friday 11th October.

**Pupil Reports this year:** In response to the 2024 Parental Questionnaire, we have reviewed when we report to parents. This year, a Teacher/Parent meeting will be held in Term 1, Term 3 and Term 6. An interim pupil report will be sent home at the end of Term 2, and Term 4, and an end of year report in Term 6. The report will provide an update on progress against age related expectations, a next step target, any information relating to support or an intervention that is in place and reference to our school values.

**Individual and Sibling Photographs:** Our regular company, Tulip, will take individual and sibling photographs on Friday 11<sup>th</sup> October. If your child has PE on this day, please send them in full uniform and they should bring their PE kit to change into. The children will receive a proof to bring home and images can be ordered online.

**Celebrating Harvest:** We love to celebrate Harvest together and will hold our annual Harvest Assembly on Thursday 24<sup>th</sup> October. For this assembly, we kindly ask that families, if possible, donate a non-perishable food item or, this year, a toiletry. All items received will be donated to Julian House – a Bath based charity supporting the homeless, and The Nest Project. The Nest Project is also a Bath-based charity and it provides support for families with children under 5 with essential items including clothing and equipment.

Julian House would welcome tinned items including tomatoes, soup, vegetables, meat and fruit, and jars of tomato pasta sauce and cartons of long-life fruit juice. The Nest Project would welcome nappies of all sizes, sensitive baby wipes, baby and children's body wash/shampoo/bubble bath, baby lotion and nappy cream. Please bring these items to the Upper School Hall on the morning of Thursday 24<sup>th</sup> October, at school drop-off – thank you in advance.

**Our Curriculum:** We wish to help parents know more about what we teach and with this, the progression of objectives and skills taught across the subjects and year groups. The staff have produced Curriculum Thread documents which you can find on the school website <u>here</u> for each subject.

### **Fixed Penalty Notice**

If your child misses school because of an unauthorised absence of 10 sessions (or 5 days), the school may issue penalty notices.

Penalty notices will be issued separately to each parent, and for each child. The fine for each penalty notice is £120, with 28 days to pay. If you pay within 21 days, the fine is reduced to £60 for each penalty notice.

For example, a family with two parents (1&2) and two children (A&B) taking unauthorised absence would receive the following penalties:

- **Parent 1** = 1 penalty for child A plus 1 penalty for child B = 2 penalties
- Parent 2 = 1 penalty for child A plus 1 penalty for child B = 2 penalties Total payable by the family = 4 penalties (or £480).

If the family in this example had paid their fine within 21 days of being issued the penalty notice, they would have had to pay £240.
