Year 1 assembly, today: This afternoon the Year 1 children impressed us with all that they have been learning. They thought of one thing that they had learned for every letter of the alphabet, and it was brilliant! They delivered their lines with such confidence – everyone in the room was brimming with pride. Well done, Year 1.

Year 5 and 6 Rugby Tournament: On Thursday, our children entered the B&NES Year 5/6 Tag Rugby Tournament held at Odd Down Sports Complex. Mr Wallace and Mrs Martin accompanied the team and both spoke highly of the children's play and conduct. Well done to Samuel, Oliver, Barney, Seb, Katie, Archie, Emma, Patrick, Thomas, Remy, Bethan and Isobel.

Use of the school mini bus: You will know that we are fortunate to have our own school mini bus to transport children to and from events and sports matches. This has fitted with our aim of enabling as many children as possible to proudly represent the school and to meet new experiences. In order to support the running costs, we will now ask for a £1 voluntary donation when your child is transported. The voluntary contribution will be mentioned in the initial consent form and an ongoing 'wallet' will be opened in School Gateway, for any donations. Thank you in advance.

Thank you for your help: Our school allotment has not had the attention it deserves since a band of parents left the school when their children moved to secondary school. However, very generously, throughout the Easter holidays Harrison's mum and grandma used their skill and energy to bring the allotment back under control, and now it looks superb. Thank you, so much, we are all very grateful.

Mobile Phone Policy: We are very aware that more and more children have their own phones. The older children – usually Year 6, can only bring their phone to school to support their independence when walking to and from school and only **if absolutely necessary.** The phone must be turned off when entering the school site and only turned on after leaving the site. All phones must be handed to the class teacher on arrival at school. We are also aware that children are members of online platforms, such as WhatsApp, and this is mentioned in an article further in the newsletter. Being a part of these groups can cause issues and upset, which we have had to manage in school. Please can I remind all parents that WhatsApp is a platform for young people aged over 16 years. Here you will find some helpful guidance from the NSPCC about safety considerations <u>Is</u> WhatsApp safe for my child? I urge you to read this and, if possible, attend an online safety meeting for parents on Wednesday 8th May at 4pm as advertised below.

Formalised trial of a one-way system on neighbouring roads: From the end of May 2024, B&NES will trial a one-way system for motorists along Charmouth Road, Lyme Road and Lyme Gardens. The trial will be in place for a minimum of six months from the week beginning Monday 27 May 2024, alongside a public consultation. During this time, the council will also monitor traffic movements to measure any impacts. At the end of the six month consultation, it will consider all of the outcomes alongside wider council policy, to inform a decision on whether to make the trial permanent. Year 4 Science



Are you worried about the safety of your child online?


Technology is a part of our everyday lives, but with developments in the digital world happening so quickly, it can be hard to keep up with the latest in online safety. Ofcom's recent annual study of children's relationships with the media and online worlds found that children aged 5 to 7 are increasingly present online with a third using social media (e.g. TikTok, WhatsApp, Instagram) unsupervised.

Online gaming among 5 to 7 year-olds has also seen a significant increase with more children of this age playing shooter games than ever before. Whilst tech firms have a legal responsibility to keep children safe online, it is also important for adults to regularly talk with children about how to stay safe online.

The NSPCC website and GetSafeOnline has a wealth of information and age-based advice about online safety. Each term, we begin our computing topics with an online safety lesson, in which children learn about age-appropriate online risks and how to make informed decisions.

As a school, we also have access to the Knowsley Online Safety parent/carer information sessions, the next of which is on Wednesday 8th May 4-4:45pm. These 30 minute sessions cover current trends, understanding the risks, practical suggestions, signposts to further support services as well as offering a 15 minute Q&A.
