NPSA Updates: Thank you to those who joined the meeting on Tuesday evening, online. We recognise this is a commitment from the Class Reps and committee members and we appreciate their time. It was good to review all of the recent successful activities and look ahead to many more over the coming months. The role of the Chair, from September, is still available – it might be that two parents wish to consider co-chairing, and this would be welcomed. Upper School Sports Day: This will be on Wednesday 4th June, with the reserve date Thursday 26th June. During the morning session, all of the children will be involved in a circuit of activities. These will take place for Year 3 and Year 4 from 9.30 am to 10.30am and for Year 5 and Year 6, from 11.00am to 12.00pm. Team events and track races will take place in the afternoon: Year 3 and Year 4 from 1.10pm to 2.00pm (approx) and Year 5 and Year 6 from 2.00pm to 2.45pm (approx). Following this, there will be a relay races.

Lower School Sports Morning: This will be held on Tuesday 17th June, with the reserve date Thursday 19th June. All of the Lower School children take part at the same time, in a carousel of activities. This will commence at 9.15am and finish at approximately 10.30am. It will conclude with a toddler race.

The Newbridge Arts Trail: We will be taking part in The Newbridge Arts Trail again this year. It is on Saturday 17th and Sunday 18th May from 10.30am - 5.00pm. We will exhibit work from every year group, alongside the work of local artists, in the Blue Room. Parents will be notified if their child's work is on display. It is difficult for the staff to manage these after this time and we wish to ensure that all children are collected safely. Thank you for your help.


Celebrating Year 6
