We cannot believe we are now half way through this term. Our busy school life means the weeks pass by, but with this, we are seeing just how ready the children are for their next transition, which is fast approaching.

Feel Good Friday – Random Acts of Kindness: Last Friday, the children and staff considered others, but with no mention of their gestures. From cards delivered, to compliments paid, to areas tidied - appreciation, care and kindness pervaded the school. A Feel Good Friday is held the last Friday of each month, when the whole school considers a theme to support our PHSE (Personal, Social, Health and Economic) curriculum.

Year 3 and Year 4 Gymnastic Competition: On Thursday, accompanied by Mrs O'Gara, two teams took part in a gymnastics competition at Baskervilles. Please read on for a report written by Mabel and Amelie.

The School Library and Music Space, in conjunction with the NPSA: As you may be aware, sadly, our Music Room is no longer in a useable condition. Music is integral to our school and it is vital that we have a dedicated base for high quality music lessons. Therefore, we have had to think carefully about the spaces we have in school and have decided to relocate the Library to the Upper School Foyer, with other smaller spaces around the school being identified, too. Although this idea has been in the pipeline, the project has had to be expedited due to the rapid deterioration of the Music Room, and we are keen to complete the project for September. We would not be able to consider implementing this project without the full support of the NPSA, and we are most grateful for the help already received, along with a financial commitment through targeted fundraising. The NPSA would hope to raise £10,000 for the initial relocation of the library storage, and some repair work which will be needed in the current Library, once the books have been sorted and the shelving removed. We would also want to use any funds raised to purchase new inclusive, diverse and inspiring books for the children to continue to foster their enjoyment in reading. With the generous help and skill of a parent, Mr Nash, we understand how the current shelving can be reconfigured in the new space. This is in good condition and we do not want to spend funds on very expensive more modern furniture.

The Newbridge Arts Trail: We will be taking part in The Newbridge Arts Trail again this year. It is on Saturday 18th and Sunday 19th May from 10.30am - 5.00pm. We will exhibit work from every year group, alongside the work of local artists, in the Blue Room. Parents will be notified if their child's work is on display. Many other examples of art will be on display in the local community, and we hope that families will be able to enjoy this long-standing event. Formalised trial of a one-way system on neighbouring roads: From the end of May 2024, B&NES will trial a one-way system for motorists along Charmouth Road, Lyme Road and Lyme Gardens. The trial will be in place for a minimum of six months from the week beginning Monday 27 May 2024, alongside a public consultation. During this time, the council will also monitor traffic movements to measure any impacts. At the end of the six month consultation, it will consider all of the outcomes alongside wider council policy, to inform a decision on whether to make the trial permanent. Our Year 1 children presented a lovely assembly last Friday to the children in the lower school, teachers and parents/ carers.



Are you worried about the safety of your child online?


Technology is a part of our everyday lives, but with developments in the digital world happening so quickly, it can be hard to keep up with the latest in online safety. Ofcom's recent annual study of children's relationships with the media and online worlds found that children aged 5 to 7 are increasingly present online with a third using social media (e.g. TikTok, WhatsApp, Instagram) unsupervised.

Online gaming among 5 to 7 year-olds has also seen a significant increase with more children of this age playing shooter games than ever before. Whilst tech firms have a legal responsibility to keep children safe online, it is also important for adults to regularly talk with children about how to stay safe online.

The NSPCC website and GetSafeOnline has a wealth of information and age-based advice about online safety. Each term, we begin our computing topics with an online safety lesson, in which children learn about age-appropriate online risks and how to make informed decisions.

As a school, we also have access to the Knowsley Online Safety parent/carer information sessions, the next of which is on Wednesday 8th May 4-4:45pm. These 30 minute sessions cover current trends, understanding the risks, practical suggestions, signposts to further support services as well as offering a 15 minute Q&A. 
