Dear Parents and Carers, I hope ypu have had a good week.

Mobile Phone Policy: The older children – usually Year 6, can **only** bring their phone to school to support their independence when walking to and from school and **only if, absolutely necessary.** The phone must be turned off when entering the school site and only turned on after leaving the site. All phones will now be collected at the school gates on arrival, and kept in the office. All children must be aware that it is a serious breach of school policy to have a phone turned on, when on the school site.

We know that children are members of online platforms, such as WhatsApp. Being a part of these groups can cause issues and upset, which we have to manage in school. Please can I remind all parents that WhatsApp is a platform for young people aged over 16 years. Here you will find some helpful guidance from the NSPCC about safety considerations <u>Is WhatsApp safe for my child?</u> I urge you to read this, please.
