Dear Parents and Carers,

**Our School Choir:** On Tuesday, our 121 strong pupil choir made their way to the RUH, where they performed to those visiting the hospital and to the RUH staff – including many of our parents. The intention was to put a smile on people's faces and to give something back to our community. This is just what they did and it was a special moment for everyone. Today, the Year 6 choir members visited Stratton House Residential Home. 25 pupils kindly took the time to provide the residents with some festive cheer when they sang a number of Christmas songs. This is all good practice for a very special event which is looming in January. The choir will travel to Birmingham to perform at Young Voices at the NEC. This is a huge undertaking, but we know from previous years that it is worth it for the joy and confidence it provides the children. Thank you choir members for your commitment and enthusiasm, to Mrs Best for all the energy you bring, and to our parent volunteers who have accompanied recent visits.

**Our NPSA** – **supporting our children, our families and our community:** Sadly, we have had to make the difficult decision not to hold the Christmas Fair and Grotto tomorrow. Due to the concerning red weather warning, we have had to prioritise everyone's safety, as I am sure you will appreciate. It is hoped that we can find another time between now and the end of term to run some of the stalls, as we know that the Christmas Fair is so enjoyed by the children and families. Thank you, sincerely, to all of the volunteers who had put time into planning the event – I know how disappointed they will be that it can't go ahead as planned. Thank you, also, to all of the families for the generous donations brought to school this morning. I can assure you that these will be used in an upcoming event.

**OPAL – Outdoor Play and Learning:** Thank you for the continued support with our OPAL Programme. The children are continuing to enjoy and benefit from the variety of play they can access. To keep moving through the programme, our OPAL mentor is meeting next week to think more about our school site and how we will utilise more spaces – this is also exciting. Please keep the cardboard boxes coming, name shoes if possible and send a waterproof coat to school each day – thank you!

Lower School Nativity Arrangements: On Tuesday 10th December and Wednesday 11th December, we will hold the Lower School Nativity performances. Each year, Year 2 pupils lead the performance and act out a short play, with plenty of singing. On Tuesday, Class 2OG will be the actors and Class 2R will be the choir. This arrangement will reverse for the Wednesday. At each performance, the Year 1 and Reception classes will join in by singing a song or performing a dance. Therefore, for Reception and Year 1 parents, it will not matter which performance you attend, unless you have a child in Year 2, and wish to come on the day they are acting. Tickets will not be issued for these performances - instead, parents should wait after drop off or return to queue at the back door of the Upper School Hall, for a 9.30am start. The play will be approximately one hour. On Wednesday 18th December, the Lower School will visit Emmanuel Church on Apsley Road. Year 2 children will complete a simple nativity and all of the Lower School will join in with Christmas songs. Parents are welcome to attend, but please know it will be a bit of a squeeze. This performance starts at 9.30am.
