#### Application for Chair of the NPSA from Katie Smith

Hello everyone, my name is Katie and I am a parent with a child in reception who started this September at Newbridge.

I believe I would be best suited for the role of Chair for the NPSA as I have a first class honours degree in Education Studies and I have 7 years experience working as a teaching assistant from Early Years to Key Stage 2, particularly with children who have special



educational needs. This has helped me understand and appreciate the importance of fundraising and the need for the PTA in assisting with this, and strengthening the school community. In addition to this, I volunteered at Oxfam for 3 years so I have good knowledge and experience in the charity sector as well.

I started and ran my own e-commerce business from scratch as well as holding down a parttime job alongside it. This enabled me to become more efficient with time management and hone my organisational skills due to managing my shop website, stock inventory, admin, accounting, performance tracking, maintaining good customer relations and excellent relationships with my manufacturers and printers as well as meeting targets and shipping deadlines.

I am an ex-pupil of Newbridge and already have a good relationship with some of the staff members. Some even taught me themselves.

At present, I am a stay-at-home parent and carer to my Mum. I am always managing my time wisely to fit around my family and understand the pressures of being in a role of responsibility with my current situation.

I am also the Bath ambassador for a single parent community app called Frolo. In this role, I have confidently lead numerous Zoom meetings and organised virtual and in person meet ups for single parents in the local community. I have brought other people on board with joining and using the app through marketing and promotions by liaising with the Frolo team. For instance, last month I was interviewed live on air by BBC Radio Bristol to talk about the app to increase traffic for signing up for it.

I really want to be Chair as I feel passionate and strongly about improving and advancing the education of all our children and understand the importance of having the NPSA when the school is the least funded for its size within the local authority. I believe I have the experience and skill set to lead the committee in achieving their targets and fundraising goals on behalf of the school. I also have the flexibility and time to carry out this role, either solely or shared with a Co-Chair.

#### **Application for Chair of the NPSA from Katherine Wellings**

I have been a parent at Newbridge Primary School since January 2013. Although Daisy has left Newbridge and is now in Y8, I still have Henry in Y6, and Elisabeth in Y3. I have been an active volunteer, event organiser, fundraiser, bid writer, Trustee, and Secretary to the NPSA throughout that time.

Prior to moving to Bath, I worked for 15 years in the advertising industry, latterly as Business Director at OgilvyOne. My job involved long hours, big meetings, bigger budgets, complex projects and a fair amount of creativity – I loved it. Many of the skills that were essential then are no less useful now as a freelance marketing strategist and stay at home mum – the budget may be smaller but the hours are longer and parenting is about as complex a project as you can get! More seriously, it has been rewarding to put my project management skills, in particular, to use as a volunteer with the NPSA across an array of



events and activities over the last 8 years. The knowledge and experience I have gained by working closely with members of the school leadership team and families alike, has given me a first-hand appreciation of the importance of the NPSA to school life, and plenty of ideas for how we can continue to make a positive contribution.

Jon and I had our first experience of the NPSA at Quiz Night, about a month after Daisy started school in 2013. We were invited to join a team of Ladybirds parents... and we won! More importantly, we had a great night and saw at first-hand how welcoming this school community is, and how hard the NPSA works to bring the community together whilst raising vital money for the school. As a result, the following year, I volunteered to join a new team organising **Quiz Night**, and it was a great success. As a team we organised this event for three years, it was a sell-out every time (moving from the lower school hall to the upper school hall because we needed to squeeze in more tables) and it remains one of the most popular events in the NPSA calendar.

During this period, I became **Class Rep** for Daisy's class, and I did that job alongside Katy Hancock and Tori Nye for six years. In 2015 I became Secretary of the NPSA, and I have done that job for five years, handing over to Mim Wharf after the AGM in July of this year. Over those five years as **Secretary**, I've attended (and minuted) almost every single NPSA meeting, but I've also been directly involved in lots of events and fundraising activities:

- With Emma Puzey and Amy Williams, I organised the inaugural Newbridge Scarecrow Trail, now an annual event.
- Working alongside Emma Puzey and Katy Hancock, I organised the Comedy & Curry Night and the Ceilidh.
- With Amy Osborn I built our pop-up Santa's Grotto, enabling us to turn the Grotto into an annual, all-day event.
- For the last five years, I've organised the Christmas Card project.
- In 2019, I was one of a team of five friends to complete the 100km Cotswold Way Challenge to raise money for the NPSA.

Away from the usual Fairs and fun, I have volunteered in other ways at school:

- I am part of the **Grants & Fundraising Team** that was set up to take a long-term view on funding for strategic projects. I used my business background to coordinate the supply and build of the new **Forest School Roundhouse**, I secured a £6k grant for the redevelopment of the courtyard in upper school, and I am still closely involved with the **Wellbeing Space Project**.
- Over the last five months I have worked alongside Louise Broom, Ollie Navias, Fiona Remnant and Sarah Squires to coordinate and manage the **Newbridge foodbank**.
- I have volunteered as a **Better Maths partner**, working in school with children in Y2 and Y6.
- I have attended many of the Paintforce and Groundforce days organised by Katy Hancock to rejuvenate areas of our school.
- I bring 'Zorro', a Labrador Retriever, into school on a fortnightly basis for Pets As Therapy sessions with a group of children.

The school's vision for its pupils is that they will "take their next steps as caring, creative and healthy young people who will actively and responsibly make a difference to our world." As a parent I wholeheartedly support that vision, and in volunteering I aim to be a part of making that difference in our children's school environment. I feel fortunate to be able to volunteer regularly within school and it has given me great satisfaction to use my skills for the benefit of our community.

I have decided to stand as Chair of the NPSA because not only am I passionately committed to the aims of our organisation, I also believe I understand the needs of our school and our community, and I have the knowledge and experience to navigate the difficulties that we are facing as a result of the impact of Covid-19.

Having worked closely with Emma Puzey and Amy Osborn – both incredibly talented and dedicated Chairs – I have a very clear idea of the commitment and creativity that this role demands and I know that I have the experience, energy, and passion to build on what we've already created, so would relish the opportunity to lead the Committee as Chair.
