#### **Dear Parents and Carers**

I hope you have had a good week. Not being at school on Monday, has made it feel an unusual week. Though, as always, at Newbridge, much has been happening and the children are continuing to demonstrate how much they enjoy the varied learning and social opportunities.

Our Reception children deserve a big shout out this week. Whilst building up their time in school during the planned induction period, all of the children have been in school at the same time and have been enjoying having lunch together. Primary school is an incredible journey; at the other end, our Year 6 pupils have been taking time to visit prospective secondary schools and have come back with exciting stories about all they have seen. This seems to come around all too fast, so I think Ritvik's message to all of the children as he was leaving Year 6 last year is an important one, 'Make the most of every day'.

#### A former Headteacher

We have recently heard that a former Headteacher of Newbridge Junior School has passed away. Mr Paul Martin was Headteacher from 1983 until 1993. I never worked alongside him, when I first worked in the junior school, however I know he was very highly regarded by staff, pupils and parents. I met Mr Martin on many social occasions, and mainly when he would come back to Newbridge, to mark teachers' retirements. I understand there will likely be current parents who attended Newbridge Junior School during his headship, and who will have their own memories of a special Headteacher.

#### Extra-curricular activities – starting Monday 26th September

Thank you to everyone who has signed up to an extra-curricular activity, with these starting from Monday. We hope these opportunities will bring a lot of fun and develop skills beyond the teaching and learning week. We offer clubs for no charge, to those children who are in receipt of free school meals, eligible by benefit. If your child has not yet signed up, please contact the office to see which clubs still have space.

#### **Everyone Active**

Everyone Active also starts next week. For those who don't know, this time is put aside before school on a Thursday morning, for anyone who wants to join in with some physical activity for health and well-being purposes. This is something we have operated for a number of years, and with all ages exercising together, and it has made for a really positive start to the day. In the past, we have had toddlers, through to grandparents, completing laps of the Upper School playground, or the field walking or running. It is not competitive in any way, though adults and children like to set their own personal challenge. Seven laps of the field or twelve laps of the top playground is approximately a mile, so this could be something to aim for. The session will start at 8.10am – if it is dry, we will be on the field and if wet, we will be on the playground. The children should wear school PE kit and bring a water bottle. Lower School children must be accompanied by an adult and Upper School children can come by themselves, but must stay on the field/playground for the duration of the session, under my supervision. Please do come along, the more the merrier.

#### Mini-Marathon Fundraiser

Earlier this week, Mr Newman sent a letter about his fundraising challenge. He is running the London Marathon, and to match his commitment, he is setting all of the children a physical challenge in school. This will take place on Friday 30th September, just before he takes on the Marathon, on Sunday 2nd October. Any funds raised will be to support wider opportunities in school – and our dream, if ever possible, would be to one day have a school mini-bus, enabling more children to access more activities.
